were teaching their children at the tables. Several have stepped forward to help. We will make adjustments for improvement, but it was a good start! One of the areas I want to develop is involving the older children in helping teach. So, parents let's work on that!

Third, I would ask for your prayers in my role as the "Lead Minister" in this church and for some special things I am working on next week. One of the things I concluded early in my study of the role of the "Preacher" in the local church, is that it is a combination of several roles. Some of those roles are by Biblical design, and some are imposed by the cultural development of the church in our modern American perspective of what is included in his responsibilities. The "evangelist" and "pastor-teacher" of the early Church seemed to be a combination of the Old Testament "Priest" and "Prophet." As priest, we are to lead the people of God in understanding the Word of God and its application to the worship and daily practice God intended. As a prophet, he was often called by God to take God's Word to a people who were not living in the culture of obedience to God, sometimes the prophet's own people, sometimes a completely foreign people, and preach repentance and change. The American church culture has preferred their preachers to be priests more than for them to be prophets. In the world of COVID and division in our nation, God is making it very clear he is calling his Preaching Ministers to be both. We are called to the priestly role to minister to His people in the local church, but God is also calling us to preach the Word of God as prophets with a message of repentance and change in a culture that is becoming less Christian.

In the next two weeks I see myself with several opportunities to practice both roles. I specifically need your prayers for two things that are pressing upon me. I have the opportunity to participate in a community wide virtual "Eldercare Conference" (taking care of our senior citizens) hosted by TSU and Texas Health, with a presentation on "Faith-Based Resources for Caregivers." The second is to offer two classes in our building on "A Responsible Christian Voter" (not about how to vote, but how to be a voter of Christ-like character). I must finish my research, writing and recording for the Eldercare Conference by Sept 25 for the conference Oct. 24. I will be presenting my lessons on voting on Wednesday nights Sept. 23 and 30. I have a lot of work yet to do.

Thank you for being a great church family over the last six months of craziness. We don't really know what the next six months will look like! But you are a special group of people called by God to a special time in our history to do special Kingdom work. I am honored that God called me to be on this journey with you!

Thank you for your continued support of the work at the Graham Street Church of Christ. The Finance Committee is continually monitoring the expenses and available funds of the church. Overall, the general fund expenses are down due to many reduced / canceled events. As of August 23rd, the Year-to-Date Expenses were \$349,133 compared to a Year-to-Date Contribution of \$327,699 (deficit of about \$21,500).
