It's a tough question

Where do I see God? Isn't that the question we as people of faith are constantly asking ourselves? To my knowledge there have been no clouds parting, no heavenly voice booming, and no mysterious God-men appearing as of late. So, where is God?

Can it be that painful?

I know a young man who is reeling from the suicide of his mentor, and all of a sudden that question is no longer an interesting theological musing for a newsletter article but a very real question. Where is God? "I don't understand," he says, "I want answers, but I don't think I'll get 'em." And he is right. The answers will not come. There is no way of explaining why his friend committed suicide. No amount of logical understanding can be applied to make sense of what has taken place. 'Why did this happen' cannot be answered.

However, he begins to formulate an answer to the other very real question that has surfaced for him, 'Where is God?' "I don't know, but I think there are times when God sends people into our lives to help, even if it is just someone to talk to. *Yname* has been really helpful. I've been talking to her a lot," he says as he reflects with thanksgiving on the people he has interacted with for the few days after receiving the news. Hmm, God sends people into our lives—do you think that might be true?

Can it be that joyful?

I was running with a young man recently and the same question was asked except under completely different circumstances: where is God? We were talking about the special relationship that had developed between him and a young lady, and without asking the question directly, he began to answer it as he reflected on this budding relationship. Where is God? "I think God sends us people in our lives who accept you for who you are and don't try to change you. She is like that. She accepts me for who I am, and because of that I want to be a better person," he says with a voice that is as glowing as his eyes as he speaks of she whom he loves.

God puts people in our lives who do not judge us, and somehow that leads to our transformation, our willingness to be transformed. Hmm, do you think God would work that way, that God would use ordinary people who are just as broken and just as flawed to bring about God's best desires for you?

Can it be that simple?

The clouds do not need to part for God to be here. Do not expect your roof to be ripped open after you pray and you look up and see the Lord staring at you ready with a response. Do not look for God's voice to come to you as a ray of light shines around you. That is the stuff of Hollywood.

You can expect to see, if you have eyes to see, the presence of the Lord with you in the people God places in your life. You can expect to hear, if you have ears to hear, the voice of God speaking through the love of those right in your midst. You can also expect to hear the voice of God in the cries of God's people where there is injustice. You can expect to know, if you have a mind to perceive, the ways God shows up in your life to bring you comfort when you need comfort, peace when you need peace, love when you need love, community when you need to be around others, solitude when you need to be alone, challenge when you need to grow, and grace when you need forgiveness and a fresh start.

You can count on the Lord to show up through the simple things like a routine job that keeps you thinking about something else for a moment, a smile from someone at the store, a simple, "How are you doing? I notice you seem a bit off today," that simply tells you that you are noticed.

Where is God? In Matthew's gospel, the angel appears to Joseph and gives Jesus the name, "Emmanuel," which means "God is with us." God is here, Emmanuel. He shall never leave you nor forsake you. He will go to the ends of the earth to find you. He will travel through all time and space to envelope you in His embrace. He will cross every distance, physical and social, to let you know that you are not alone. He will prevail over every pandemic to bring life where there is death. In fact, He will stop at nothing to bring you life, even going through death itself to defeat its power over you. Emmanuel, God is with us, and he is called Christ Jesus.

We ended our meeting by sending cards of cheer to our members in care centers and home bound. They are in our prayers and wish them well.


