Old Testament Lesson

Exodus 17:1-7 (NRSV) Lector: Rae Smith

¹ From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the LORD commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. ² The people quarreled with Moses, and said, "Give us water to drink." Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the LORD?" ³ But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?" ⁴ So Moses cried out to the LORD, "What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me." ⁵ The LORD said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. ⁶ I will be standing there

in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink." Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. ⁷ He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarreled and tested the LORD, saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?"

JGospel Lesson

Matthew 20:1-16 (NRSV)

¹ "For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. ² After agreeing with the laborers for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. 3 When he went out about nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle in the marketplace; ⁴ and he said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right.' So they went. 5 When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same. ⁶ And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, 'Why are you standing here idle all day?' ⁷ They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard.' 8 When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, 'Call the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and then going to the first.' 9 When those hired about five o'clock came, each of them received the usual daily wage. ¹⁰ Now when the first came, they thought they would receive more; but each of them also received the usual daily wage. 11 And when they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, ¹² saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' 13 But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? ¹⁴ Take what belongs to you and go; I choose to give to this last the same as I give to you. ¹⁵ Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?' ¹⁶ So the last will be first, and the first will be last."

ISSUE ONE-PAGER: ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE/CLIMATE

The UCC Environmental Justice/Climate:

- General Synod 32 (2019) "Let Justice Roll Down Declaring Support for the Green New Deal and Affirming the Intersectionality of Climate Justice with all Justice Issues." With this resolution, the UCC became the first denomination to endorse the GND.
- General Synod 31 (2017) "The Earth is the Lord's Not Ours to Wreck: Imperatives for a New Moral Era." A resolution on the moral imperatives for people of faith in response to a presidential administration that "ignores science, defunds the Environmental Protection Agency, and withdraws from the Paris Climate Accord."
- General Synod 29 (2013) "Resolution Urging Divestment-Along with Other Strategies-from Fossil Fuel Companies to Address Climate Change," the UCC became the first denomination to pass a resolution endorsing divestment from fossil fuel companies.
- The UCC has served as the leading organizational force in the birth of the environmental justice movement, by defining and highlighting environmental racism through research.
- The UCC published a recent report on toxic air pollution; highlighting the urgency of addressing
 the health impacts on communities living near toxic air pollution caused by chemical processing
 facilities.
