## Twenty-Eighth Sunday of Ordinary Time 11th October 2020

### MIND YOUR FINGERS - CLANG

This Sunday, the 11th of October, is the start of 'Prisons Week.' The clanging of a prison cell door can be a defining moment in a person's life. It is perhaps the ultimate noise that signifies the end of the wonderful gift of freedom, something from then onwards that can only be dreamed about. There are of course a great many different kinds of prison, each door with its own unique sounding 'clang'.

Last week we celebrated the Harvest. Starvation is a prison like no other as it may have imprisoned you through no fault of your own. To starve in a world of plenty reflects the human made imbalances of how the planet we live on is mismanaged and abused. For those in the Starvation Prison there are no 'Eat by Dates' just, 'At any Date'!

Then there is the prison of addiction with each particular addiction having its own particular 'clang' to its own particular prison door.

Then there is the prison of the Body and Mind. Many find themselves confined in an inadequate body or dysfunctional mind where the clanging never seems to stop, and their imprisonment is life-lasting.

Finally, there is the ultimate prison of self-importance, generated by a belief in the infallibility of one's own opinion. The horror of this type of prison is that they are self-made. Jesus called people who made prisons like this 'Pharisees' and 'Sadducees'. The foundations of such prisons are made from self-love and an inability to consider the 'Other.'

*A former inmate of a Nazi Concentration Camp was visiting a friend who had shared the ordeal with him. "Have you forgiven the Nazis?" he asked his friend. "Yes". "Well, I haven't. I am still consumed with hatred for them.". "In that case," said his friend gently, "they still have you in prison."*

## **Parish Financial Report – Summer 2020**

This report details the Parish finances as of 31 August 2020 and includes the summary accounts for 2019 that would have been presented at the parish AGM at the start of the summer.

Our reserves are reasonably healthy with a bank balance of some £66,000 (at 30 June 2020) although that is expected to fall to approx £50,000 by year-end. The net bank balance has been falling gradually over recent years and it would be appropriate for the parish to consider fund raising in due course to support its mission into the future.

I am happy that we carry a certain deficit at present, and in particular while offertory giving is depressed by the pandemic. The possibility of selling of a site and undertaking building works carries a significant risk for our parish finances and for its mission for the next 30 years and beyond and it is important that we get this right. Handling this well will provide a clear shared vision on the basis of which we can seek to build financial support for our mission. Meanwhile, it is appropriate that we continue normal encouragement to consider donations, Gift Aid and standing orders, and a reminder that the parish (and our share of the work of the diocese as a whole) is funded almost entirely by these donations and not from a central church source.

I would like to thank those who sat on the Parish Finance Committee (“Finance & General Purposes Committee”) during the period to which these accounts relate for their support and advice to myself and to Fr David before me: Alan Lion, Rory Flynn, Margaret McClinton, Sean Leathem, Damian Wheeler, Arthur Gomez. I would also like to thank Eileen Hudson for her work as Gift Aid coordinator, which enhanced the value of offertory giving and other donations by nearly £19,000.

As I am still fairly new to the parish I would welcome recommendations of parishioners with appropriate skills whom I might approach to ensure that the parish continues to receive prudent counsel and support on the stewardship of its material goods. If you have any questions or comments on the financial statements please do raise them. I would intend that the Parish Finance Committee will meet before the end of the year.

Please pray for all of our benefactors, past and present, through whose generosity we are able to gather to do the Lord’s work.

## **2019 Accounts**

### *Income*

- Offertory & Collections of £82,600 was similar to the previous year at £84,100. Donations and Legacies of £13,400 (2018: £5,100) includes a donation of £10,000 towards the cost of the TV screens at St Joseph’s and associated audio-visual expenses.

- Tax Rebates of £18,900 on Offertory and Collections were in-line with 2018. We are able to claim Gift Aid on only a part of our loose cash collection. We would encourage parishioners who pay tax and who do not already do so to consider Gift Aiding their contributions, which would allow the parish to claim an additional 25p for every £1 given.
- Other income includes rent from the Polish Community for their use of St Joseph's.
- Both the 2020 Forecast and the 2019 Actuals have one-off income being
  - 2020: a refund from the Diocese of £2,431 for a duplicated item in the 2019 accounts
  - 2019: an insurance reclaim of £1,930 for the boiler repair at St Joseph's.

### *Expenditure*

- Personnel covers the support of the priest (including the offerings at Christmas and Easter) and the remuneration of the Parish Assistant.
- Liturgy and Pastoral includes our annual grant of £15,000 to Trinity Trust Team.
- Establishment and property include £6,200 for utilities, £3,500 contribution to St John's, Farncome, Insurance £3,200, Council tax £2,100, equipment servicing £3,770, grounds maintenance £2,400. Building maintenance was restricted to mainly smaller items.
- The Diocesan levy has increased by some £7,000 to £25,500 per year. The levy is our share of the central costs of the Diocese. Around 1/3 of this is used to support clergy (training, retirement, chaplaincies, sickness), 1/3 is used for formation & education and 1/3 for the other central costs (finance, HR, safeguarding, etc). The full accounts for the diocese were approved by the Trustees this week and will be available shortly.
- The increase in expenditure over the base period 2017 reflects (a) the cost of the TV screens and related electrical works, (b) other safety related works (Quinquennial related) at St Joseph's and St Edmund's and (c) the Alpha/DR costs.

### **2020 Forecast**

- The full year forecast (as of 31 August 2020) reflects a projected deficit (excess of expense to revenue) of some £26,000 compared with a budget deficit of £8,000, a variance of £(18,000).
- The single item which contributes most of this decline in the Parish finances is the impact of the lock-down on the Cash Offertory since end-March. While Masses have recommenced the Cash Offertory has been scaled back along with the associated Tax Rebates.

### **Summary**

- Income and expenditure for 2019 resulted in a deficit of around £1,000.
- The 2020 full year forecast is a deficit of some £26,000, the year-end 2020 cash position is expected to be approx £50,000.
- While the lock-down was eased end-June and Masses have resumed the ongoing impact of the latest Government changes is not known at this time. Further work will be necessary to better understand the shape of the Parish needs and its future plans to ensure that the Parish financials can meet these needs in what is likely to be turbulent economic times.

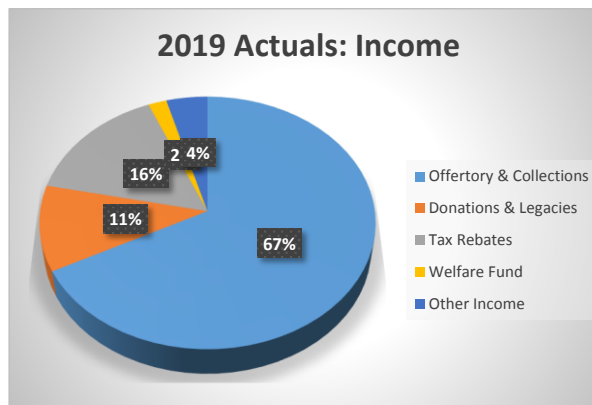
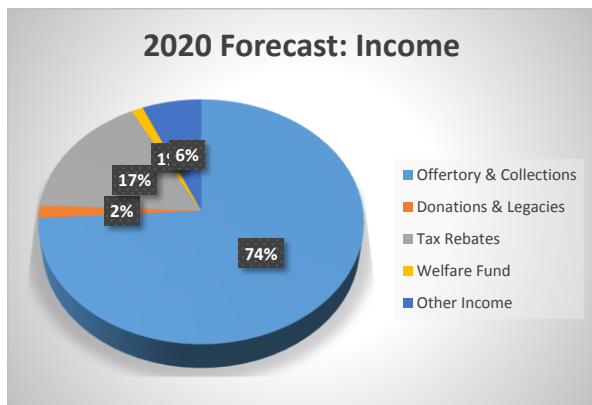
