### **Bulletin Announcements and Updates—**

#### **Developing Leaders**

Tragedy struck the Dallas Cowboys Sunday as their leader and superstar quarterback, Dak Prescott, went down with a horrific ankle injury. He had surgery that very night and his prognosis is good, but he will probably not be able to play again this season. The injury was painful and destructive to Dak, and both he and the team were dramatically impacted emotionally. But the Dallas management knew that injures are part of football and it could happen to anyone, even your star quarterback, like it also did in the same game to Trysten Hill, a defensive tackle, and they were prepared with a backup in both positions on their roster. In fact, they had brought in a veteran all-pro quarterback in Andy Dalton (former TCU and Cincinnati Bengal), just in case. Dalton came in and led the offense to a win.

Making sure there is someone to step in to do the job in every position should the first stringer need help or to be replaced is good leadership. Successful teams must not only coach the players on the field, but they must also prepare the players who are not on the field to come in and do their jobs effectively when needed. Church leadership has a similar responsibility according to Eph. 4:11-16. It is the leaders responsibility to prepare the members for works of service so that each member will be able to do their part for the successful completion of their role in the works of service God has planned for the Church (Eph. 2:10; 4:16). This is crucial for the building up of the Body of Christ to spiritual maturity and in love to be like Christ in the world (Eph. 1:22-23; 4:11-16). In fact, the Lord has built into His design for the Church a system of constantly developing the next generation of leaders by making it the responsibility of leaders to be training the next leaders.

Jesus was doing this with the Apostles (Mark 3:13-19). Paul was doing this with Timothy and Titus (2 Tim. 2:1-2; Tit. 1:5; 2:15). The Elders were doing with Deacons (1 Tim. 3; 1 Pet. 5); and even the older men with younger men, and older women with younger women (1 Tim. 5; Tit. 2). Many churches have suffered from the loss of great superstar leaders with no one to fill their shoes. Every ministry leader should be training the next generation of leaders for that ministry. If you don't, the ministry will become less effective, or even die when the current leadership ends.

What does it take to have this kind of consistent leadership in the church generation after generation? Here are some key factors: (Continued on Page 2)

- Intentionality make training leaders part of the mission, planning and goals for the success of the ministry.
- 2) **Selection** prayerfully pick people to train who have character, spiritual maturity, giftedness, and a desire to serve.
- 3) Willing Volunteers members willing to step up and learn and serve
- 4) **Invest Time with them** leaders cannot be trained by reading a book. Look at what Jesus was doing in His training program Mark 3:13-15. He specifically picked some young men he could spend time with to show them how to do ministry, so he could send them out to do ministry themselves.
- 5) **Develop their gifts** help them discover and develop their gifts to be applied to the Lord's work.
- 6) **Send them** give them assignments to do with the leaders and then let them go do it on their own, being always available to advise, encourage, help, but allowing them to lead. Commission them and let them go.
