# **Reimagining Our Future: Justice and Joy for All Children**

By participating in the multifaith National Observance of Children's Sabbaths weekend organized by the Children's Defense Fund (CDF), we are part of a powerful, diverse multifaith voice for children spanning our nation and crossing all lines of income, race, ethnicity, and political party. What unites us is the belief that God calls us to protect children, especially the poorest and most vulnerable, and the conviction that our faith calls us to live out God's justice and compassion. This inspiring weekend focuses attention on the urgent plight of children in our nation and calls us to put our faith into action to meet children's needs through direct service and work for justice.

This weekend is about connecting the very real problems confronting children and families with a call for all religious traditions in unity to respond with justice and care, and translating that faithful concern into action. The Children's Sabbath is a weekend that unites places of worship and all faiths across the nation in shared concern for children and common commitment to improving children's lives and working for justice on their behalf. In that respect, it is bigger and more powerful and more inspiring than the efforts of any one congregation on its own.

### Children's Sabbath Weekend is a:

- Celebration to strengthen existing efforts for children and to commit to new advocacy actions. We are guardians or protectors for our children!
- Time to pray, study, and reflect about our faith and our responsibility to nurture and protect children.
- Time to put prayer into action; to serve children directly; and to speak out demanding justice for children.
- Time to include children's justice in our voting decisions and to demand our legislators look out for our children too.

# The State of America's Children® in

# **MARYLAND**

2020 Factsheet



### **Child Population**

- 1,340,148 children lived in Maryland in 2018.
- **58 percent** were children of color: 31 percent were Black; 16 percent were Hispanic; 6 percent were Asian/Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander; and <1 percent were American Indian/Alaska Native.

### **Child Poverty**

- 12 percent of Maryland's children were poor in 2018–a total of 152,237 children–and children of color were disproportionately poor.
- 19 percent of Black, 14 percent of Hispanic and 6 percent of white children were poor.
- 6 percent of children were extremely poor (their family had income below half the poverty level).
- 12 percent of children under 6 were poor.

### **Income and Wealth Inequality**

 \$122,100 was the median income for white families with children compared with \$68,500 for Black and \$63,300 for Hispanic families in 2017.

### **Housing and Homelessness**

- **17,122** homeless children were enrolled in public schools during 2016-2017.
- 2.7 full-time jobs at minimum wage were needed for a family to afford a two-bedroom rental unit at fair market rent in FY2019.

### **Child Hunger and Nutrition**

- 15 percent of children lived in food-insecure households in 2017.
- **36 percent** of children ages 10-17 were overweight or obese in 2017.
- 19 percent of children relied on the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) in FY2018.
- 79 percent of children receiving free or reducedprice lunch during the 2017-2018 school year did not participate in Summer Nutrition Programs in 2018.

### **Child Health**

- **46,770** children ages 0-18 (**3 percent**) were uninsured in 2018.
- 618,583 children ages 0-18 were enrolled in Maryland Children's Health Program (combined Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program) in 2018.

### **Early Childhood**

- **\$15,403** was the average annual cost for an infant in center-based child care in 2018.
- **38 percent** of 4-year-olds were enrolled in state-funded preschool during 2017-2018.

### **Education**

- 78 percent of Black, 78 percent of Hispanic and
   52 percent of white 4<sup>th</sup> grade public school students were not proficient in reading in 2019.
- 80 percent of Black, 79 percent of Hispanic and
   50 percent of white 8<sup>th</sup> grade public school students were not proficient in reading in 2019.
- 85 percent of Black, 74 percent of Hispanic and
   93 percent of white students graduated high school on time during 2016-2017.
- 9 percent of Black, 3 percent of Hispanic and 3 percent of white public school students had at least one out-of-school suspension in 2013-2014.

### **Child Welfare**

- 7,743 children were abused or neglected in 2018
- **3,973** children were in foster care on the last day of FY2018.

### **Youth Justice**

- 549 children were in residential placement in 2017. 77 percent were Black; 8 percent were Hispanic; and 15 percent were white.
- 13 children were in adult prisons in 2017.

### **Gun Violence**

 60 children and teens were killed with guns in 2017

**Note:** All numbers in this factsheet are included in the Children's Defense Fund's *The State of America's Children*® 2020 report, and most have been rounded to the nearest whole number. Facts for states and the District of Columbia were omitted when data were not available. Citations for all data may be found in *The State of America's Children*® 2020.
