TITLE: KEPT FROM THE HOUR OF TESTING

TEXT: Revelation 3:10 –13

I. THE PROMISE Verse 10

- A. It is a promise that needs to be viewed from an <u>end-times</u> perspective.
- B. It is a promise relative to a time in the future of unprecedented and indescribable turmoil known in scripture as the tribulation.

Jeremiah 30 Daniel 12:1 Joel 2:2 Matthew 24:21

C. It is a promise to be realized in the future but is never to be taken lightly in the present since the imminent rapture of the church is involved.

John 14:3

- 1. The rapture is a planned event.
- 2. The rapture concerns believers only.
- 3. The rapture is an imminent event. (Could happen at any time..)

The fact that the rapture is imminent should motivate us to purity not wanting to be caught with our hands in the cookie jar, so to speak. 1 John 3: 2-3

II. THE COMMAND "...hold fast what you have..."

A. It is a command to remain loyal to Christ and Christianity especially in difficult times.

"..hold fast what you have..."

Hosea 6:6

Old southern preacher said, "It's time for our (the) church to wake up and sing up, preach up and pray up and never give up or let up or back up or shut up until the church is filled up or we go up. Amen!"

B. It is a command to understand the times in an effort to remain loyal to the Lord.

1 Chronicles 12:32

(note the "I wills" vv. 10 & 12 three times in 12) (...hold fast to what you have)

A. It is an encouragement to cherish the word of God, i.e. its principles, its truth and its sufficiency and the fact that it is never antiquated and is therefore applicable in all generations.

B. It is an encouragement to be cognizant of the fact that rewards in heaven can be forfeited although salvation to those who are genuine believers is secure.

...so that no one will take your crown...

Conclusion:

What do we do until we are taken out of this world either by death or rapture?

Occupy — work, serve, make a living, etc.

Purify – live holy lives.

Watch – for His coming, be ready, note the times.

Worship – go to church, praise, thanksgiving, honor and reverence the Lord.
