

Jesus Reads a Bible Scroll

 On the last day of the week, Jesus and the people in His town went to the synagogue. This was like our church building.




A Take-Home Paper or Early Elementary

"This is my favorite part!" said Evan. He took Ava's hand. They walked with all the other children to the front and sat on the steps, too.


Pastor Bennett told a special Bible story just for the children. He even showed them a rolled-up paper he made to look like a scroll.

You will need for each scroll:

- Brown paper bag
- Markers

To Make Your Family Scrolls:

- 1. Cut a rectangle out of a paper bag.
- 2. Crumple up the bag many times.
- 3. Flatten the paper.
- 4. Use markers to write your family's favorite Bible verse or the memory verse on the paper.
- 5. Roll up the paper from two opposite ends to make a scroll.

Take It Deeper

Instead of making one scroll for your entire family, have each family member make a scroll and write a favorite Bible verse on it.

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
