#### A Note From The Pastor November 2020

November is a special month for us all. The 1<sup>st</sup> is All Saints Day. This is a time that we remember all of the people of faith that made our worship possible today, especially those who went to the Lord in the past year. We celebrate their lives on the first Sunday of the month. We thank God for the parents/ grandparents who prayed for us, drug us to Sunday school and church. The saints of the church who served the church as teachers, volunteers, officers, and role models are special to us. We also remember the saints, great and small, who shared the faith, started churches, and even gave their lives for the sake of the Gospel. All Saints Day should cause us to think about the example we are displaying and the heritage we will leave.

Soon into November is Veteran's Day. I was always taught that Memorial Day is the day we remember those who gave their lives in the service of our country and Veteran's Day is when we honor the veterans living among us. The reason we have this great country and the freedoms we enjoy is the service of the veterans. We would not have the lives we live or be able to worship the way we do without the veterans! Always remember the reason we honor them is not because they served in the armed services. That is just a symbol of the main reason. The most important reason we honor them is that every one of them were willing to die for our freedom and the sake of all who live in this country. We continually owe them a debt of gratitude.

Then we have the number one family day of our country, Thanksgiving. More people travel back home to be with family on Thanksgiving than any other day of the year. We eat too much and we talk too much (hopefully not about politics). We celebrate the importance of family in a way we do not do on any other day of the year. We should never forget the importance of family to our way of life and to our service to the Lord. We should also never forget the reasons behind our day of "Thanksgiving." We could debate about how the Pilgrims celebrated, what they ate, was it a "thanksgiving" in the way we celebrate, and many other issues surrounding the traditions of Thanksgiving. Those things don't really matter. What we celebrate is a group of Christian people who were grounded so strong in their faith they were willing to risk everything for the sake of practicing their faith in the way they thought was important and insuring their children were raised in their faith culture. The English demanded they worship in the Church of England, leave, or go to prison.

### A Note from the Pastor Continued

The Dutch allowed them to worship, but they saw their children assimilating into the secular culture of the Dutch. They headed on an exodus to find their holy land. They risked it all for the sake of serving Christ in the way they thought best and raising their children in the Lord. Their first year was bad and many died, but they never waivered in their faith. They did not celebrate the hard times, but they did celebrate that God was with them through their valley of the shadow of death and now their cups were running over. Thanksgiving is a day for family, but it is also a day to be thankful for the God who never left us or forsook us through the good, the bad, and yes even the COVID. Gather with those who are family to you, be thankful, and celebrate the Lord in your life this past year.

For some of you Black Friday is a day that rivals the other holidays of the past year and is akin to the parting of the Red Sea for the people to cross over to their promised land of shopping. To me it is more up there with the plagues.

Finally, we close out the month of November with the beginning of Advent. It is a time of remembering the "Coming" of the Lord. Both that time that Jesus gave up His Glory in heaven and His place on the throne to "come" as a human and be born in a manger. He came to be one of us. He came to show us the way we should live, to teach, demonstrate, and admonish. More than anything, He came to take our sins on the cross, then through the Resurrection, to bring us everlasting life. Remember Pray-Vote-Pray. Pray about how to vote, vote for who

God is leading you to vote, pray for our country no matter who wins.

November is a full month. I just can't grasp that it is here already!

## Capital Improvement Plan for the Rockville Methodist Church

A committee of several members of the church have met for the purpose of identifying building repair projects and to place them in categories of importance in order to prioritize projects in an order of greatest need and provide cost estimates of repairs and present their findings to the Committee of Finance to acquire funding for the repairs.

An Architect has completed a thorough inspection/evaluation of the building and has identified structural

and cosmetic projects for attention as funds are available. With that report as well as visual observation the committee has assigned the following categories:

- 1. Imperative/Priority-improvements or repairs needed to neutralize a current threat to the structural or aesthetic integrity of the building and/or the safety of the people.
- 2. Deferred Need-an improvement or repair needing attention in the near to intermediate future if possible. Not currently critical but could become so over time. Important to the long-term viability of the building and our ministry.
- 3. Want/Desire-a non-crucial improvement or repair which would add to the overall beauty, function of the building and purpose of our ministry.
- 4. Minor Repair/Maintenance/Cleaning-an improvement or repair which may be accomplished with minimal effort and little to no cost, either by a paid contractor or by a qualified individual donating time and/or supplies.

The intent of this committee is to recommend repairs be made in the most cost effective manner but to recognize that the long term goal is to not merely repair the project for the interim but to repair the project for the long term so that future monies will not be needed to repair a project which has already been completed.

Projects within the scope of expertise and ability of individuals attending the Church or volunteer participation will be undertaken when time, material and weather permit the work to be completed.

16. Remove weeds and clean lower level patio area.

17. Paint black railing on south Fellowship Hall porch.

18. Repaint church sign.

19. Clean interior of fellowship hall windows.

20. Clean exterior of fellowship hall windows.

21. Clean lower level windows.

22. Repaint chapel.



2. It requires all my spare time; It keeps me from doing my Christian duty. It produces so many good shows that I must see; It restores my knowledge of the world.


3. It keeps me from the study of God's Word. It leads me in the path of failing to attend worship and doing nothing for the kingdom of God.

4. Yea, though I live to be a hundred years old I shall view my TV as long as it works. It seems to be my closest companion; Its sounds and pictures they comfort me.


5. It provides entertainment for me and keeps me from doing important things with my family. It fills my head with ideas which differ from God's will.
