A DAY IN WORSHIP: 1 Timothy 2:1-4 says, "I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." These verses summarize what we do in the prayer of the church. We offer supplications to God for all people. The first prayer is typically our response to the sermon. We ask God to do his work in our lives, the work we just heard about from the pulpit. The rest of the petitions follow a standard pattern that includes prayers for our nation, the sick, the lost, our synod and other Christian churches, and our homes. The prayer of the church is one of the most significant parts of our liturgy. Its importance cannot be overstated. If we believe that everything depends on God, then we can't help but pray. We pray for his blessing, protection, and salvation for every person and for ourselves. Whenever your mind drifts during the prayers (something I struggle with as well), gently call your attention back to God. Help us and others by lifting your heart to God, asking him to bestow his favor on us and on all.

**HYMN OF THE DAY:** Our hymn of the day is hymn 783, *Take My Life and Let It Be.* In the Gospel reading, the third servant takes the money entrusted to him by the master and buries it in the ground. Like that servant, we too have received trusts from God, the trust of life itself and the trust of his kingdom. What are we going to do with these trusts? Will we use them or bury them? Through this hymn, we pray that God would move us to use what he has given us faithfully and for his glory. Our days, our hands, our feet, our voices, our wealth, our wills, our love—we pray that God would take all this and direct it so that "we can live ever, only, all for thee."

**ABOUT THE BULLETIN COVER:** The master entrusted his servants with large amounts of money. It was to be put to good use, not buried. In the same way, our Lord has given us the great treasure of His Word and many other gifts to be put to use and invested into the lives of others. All the while, the results are in His hands, just as we ourselves are in the hands of our gracious Master.


