


A NEW CHURCH YEAR

1 John 1:8; John 3:16; Matthew 5:16


- Let us come before God in true repentance, seeking forgiveness and amendment of our lives as we follow the Lord.

SERMON

CREED

LORD'S PRAYER


Our Father who art in heaven,

forever and ever. Amen.


