"Too Safe to Give Thanks"

I watched a little boy in the toy department as his mommy went to the next aisle. He looked up as she pushed her cart away, but he could not pull himself away from the fascinating truck that transformed into a robot. He kept manipulating the toy while his mother disappeared around the corner. I was concerned that he would wander off in the wrong direction when he realized that he had been left behind, so I lingered sensing that my errand to the hardware section could wait. Sure enough, after a few minutes he raised his head to find his mom and she was not there, and instantly his face became distorted and tears welled up in his eyes. I took a step or two toward the aisle that I thought she had gone down and peeked around the corner and she was there. When I looked back at the boy he had started to run, in the wrong direction. Why do we have that instinct to run when we are scared, when we really need to slow down? Do I go after him, or his mom? I moved back to the aisle where I could see the mother and I said, "Is this your son over here?" It started her, and she was instantly afraid. She didn't have to answer, I knew. I said, "He took off that way. I will go to the other side." Mom took off calling for Tommy, and I went around the other corner. When I got to the other end of the aisle and looked back they had seen each other and they both ran to each other. She knelt down to pick him up and he jumped up into her arms. They were both crying. When mom turned around to go back to her cart, she saw me and said thank you. I smiled and walked away, and I have never seen them since. I don't know their story. I don't know if she is a single mom, or the little boy had brothers and sisters. And I don't know if they will ever get separated in a store again. One thing I do know as a dad who has searched for a daughter in the toy department, the tears shed when they got back together were of joy and thankfulness.

I am sure the prodigal son and his father cried as they embraced upon his return home. In those tears was a thankful father glad to have his son home, and a thankful son that his father received him back. The sinful woman washed Jesus feet with her tears, dried them with her hair and anointed them with ointment. And Jesus, I am sure with tears in his eyes, told those who ridiculed her to leave her alone for she was showing great love preparing him for death. And as he spoke with acceptance and forgiveness, her tears turned to thankfulness. Maybe we are too safe and secure to give thanks. Maybe it takes a sense of fear and lostness to really feel deep thankfulness for the sense of safety and security. Maybe it takes a sense of not knowing where to turn for help and hopelessness to have a true appreciation for knowing you are home.
