Satan's first Christmas

Where was satan at Christmas when? Satan has access to the halls of heaven from Job and we know that he knew something was a foot. Maybe he even guessed that God was about to have feet. Satan must have realized the stir in heaven & he knew the plan that a human offspring would be his destruction (crush his head). But he only knew what he could figure out. See satan is not omniscient.

One of the most telling verses is "... the wisdom which none of the rulers of this age has understood; for if they had understood it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory." (1 Corinthians 2:8) When Jesus died on the cross, satan thought he'd finally won.

Lucifer tried on numerous occasions to destroy God's plan. In The Messiah's lineage is an obvious catalogue of sins and satan had been trying to obliterate the linage of David from whom that righteous seed would come. It's true about Christmas and it's true for your life! He knows how to rescue -protect the godly when we walk with Him. Even when it doesn't make any human sense. Christmas reassures us that God will always keep His promises- always! No matter what it costs Him! Is He born in your heart this Christmas?

Rejoicing in Jesus faithfulness at Christmas and every day,




DEACONS CORNER

In this time of political unrest and divisiveness you may feel like me and have the words of Psalm 82 come to mind. 1 God presides in the great assembly; he gives judgement among the "gods": 2 "How long will you defend the unjust and show partiality to the wicked?" 3 Defend the cause of the weak and fatherless; maintain the rights of the poor and oppressed. 4 Rescue the weak and needy; deliver them from the wicked... 8 Rise up, O God, judge the earth, for all the nations are your inheritance.

We see so many in our nation who aim to be "human judges and 'powers that be' who set themselves up as little gods." As verse 5 says, They know nothing, they understand nothing, They walk in darkness. . . We can begin to be distracted or even feel overwhelmed wondering when God will show His Justice and expose these people for who they are and vindicate us Christians through his judgement.

Luckily for us, we can confidently leave this for God and in his perfect timing, and instead, focus on the stark contrast we see in Psalm 84: 1 How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord Almighty! 2 My soul yearns, even faints, for the courts of the Lord; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God. 3 Even the sparrow has found a home, and the swallow a nest for herself. . . 10 Better is one day in your courts than a thousand elsewhere; . . . 12 O Lord Almighty, blessed is the man who trusts in you.

Perhaps some popular praise songs come to mind when you read through this Psalm. Doesn't God love us even more than the sparrow he provides a home for? The psalmist envies the sparrows for being able to build their nests in the temple walls and live there permanently. How much more are we ensured to live permanently with the Almighty God as Christians. Not our timing but His. One day we will be "Home Sweet Home".

Peace Be with You!

Would you like to feel more at peace throughout your day? Now, more than ever, we need to feel more calm, peaceful and secure in our lives.

Feeling a sense of inner peace may seem elusive, especially in the world we live in today. It's easy to harbor negativity and feel a sense of anger, insecurities and frustration with all that is going on at this time in our world, country, states, communities and homes. We can get stuck in a continuous loop of negative stress and strife. It's normal and understandable.

Regardless of your circumstances, you can take charge and live a more peaceful life. How?

Be still. Quiet your mind and slow your breathing. Doing belly breathing, not shallow breathing, can help slow your down your mind and relax your body. At first, your mind may be noisy with lots of thoughts, but in time, you will feel a sense of calmness and peace. Sometimes quiet, soothing music or being in nature can help. Just a few minutes a day is a great start.

Consider prayer as a way to practice this stillness.

"Be Still and know that I am God" Psalm 46:10

Power up. Don't give power over your emotions to people who drain your energy and try to bring you down. Remember no one forces you to feel any particular way. You choose to feel a certain way. So be around energy enhancers, not energy drainers. This will help you feel more positive and in control.

Be grateful. Embrace an attitude of gratitude. Think of three things that you are grateful for each day and why. Maybe have your family say what they're grateful for around the dinner table, before bedtime or start your morning with a gratitude list. When you complain, feel negative, insecure, stop, acknowledge your feelings then think of how you will you respond in a respectful and positive way. Call a friend, reframe your thoughts to a more positive way of thinking that is more productive. For example, "What's another way to look at this?" or "I am grateful for this or that and I choose to be the change I wish to see." It's normal to feel negative at times, and, important to acknowledge your feelings. Control what you can by having a different perspective. What you are unable to control, change the way you look at what is bothering you so you can reclaim your emotions in a way that will better serve you and, then take action. Coming from a place of grace and gratitude will help you on your journey of living well. Be realistic and resilient and resolve that YOU can make a difference in your thought processes that will help you with any negative emotions you may feel.

Phil 4:6-7 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

By doing these 3 things, your perceptions and perspectives can help change for the positive and help you feel more at peace every day.

Today, more than ever, we need to come together to help lift up each other, promote more peace within ourselves and realize that we are truly better together when we come from a place of peace and a positive attitude. It starts with you. You have the power through the Holy Spirit. **Peace be with you.**



After two or three times of reuniting because of his begging her to come back (despite Annie's counsel to not do so) she eventually invited him to come to Song Sawang (our Thai church that "J" is now a part of).

For about 3 weeks he did not come back to church, which was expected because she got out of that relationship and now has a new relationship with Jesus. A power encounter happened between them. They both know there is power in the name of Jesus. The boyfriend needs to be in power and he has now seen "another power" more powerful than himself. He also sees how "this power" has changed "J's" life. And "J" has discovered for herself that Jesus has empowered her to actually make the decision to not reunite with this man.

If you are like me you are glad for "J" but also hopeful for her now ex-boyfriend. As we like to sing, "There is power in the name of Jesus. There is power in the name of Jesus. There is power in the name of Jesus. To break every chain, break every chain, break every chain."

"J's" chains are gone. She has been set free. Maybe her ex-boyfriend saw enough of Jesus's power in Sunday's worship that his chains might be next? I don't know. What I do know is that Jesus is power is stronger than any other power. "J" is a testimony to this as are all the women at NightLight who have come to believe in and follow Jesus.

Guess what ... I saved it to the end ...

Guess who got off drugs? Guess who has come to Church every Sunday since then, except once? Guess who has stopped abusing "J"?

You guessed it!! J's boyfriend!

I already talked to him this morning as he dropped of "J" at NightLight and he smiled and said, "I am not doing drugs any more and I will see you on Church on Sunday!"

Praise the Lord! Now, let's pray him into salvation and a relationship with Jesus! Will you join me? His name is "S".





The judgment which came from one offense resulted in condemnation, but the free gift... resulted in justification. For if by the one man's offense death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ. — Romans 5:16-17

What is the most special gift you've ever received? Did you receive it on your birthday, for Christmas, or on another occasion? Through the years I've received some amazing gifts, but Jesus is the most marvelous gift ever given. And it is the most needed gift ever given.

The apostle Paul taught that by one man — Adam — sin entered the world, and death was pronounced upon all, for in Adam all have sinned.
