Good News!

The news of a licenced vaccine this week has given a very welcome glimmer of hope in this pandemic. And none too soon given the grim news about the closure of some major retailers and a couple of particularly wet and dark days.

The passage from Isaiah that we read this week is addressed to the people of Israel in exile in Babylon. While Isaiah last week expressed a confident longing for God to come, this week we hear both a message of comfort and consolation and a command to confidently proclaim an end to the harsh conditions his people have suffered. If we look closely at the text and read it as part of the wider scriptures, we see that at the heart of this good news is the atonement for the sin of the people. That what was broken by their faults is made whole again by the offering of Jesus Christ of himself in love to his Father: that same offering that we make whenever we celebrate the Mass.

Two of the features of Catholic church music in the late 20th Century have been the desire to set scriptural texts to music and a turn to popular folk melodies (this latter a feature of Christian music also in Roman times and in the settings of Ralph Vaughan Williams). You may like then to have a listen to Chrysogonous Waddell's version of Isaiah 40 ('O comfort my people') to the Irish folk tune Bi Iosa am chroise. In terms of capturing the joy of Advent, little betters Charles Wesley's Lo he comes. In contrast to the intimacy of the Rorate Caeli (see last week) it provides a very grand hymn often with wonderful organ accompaniment and the usual melody (Helmsley) moves us from praise through sorrow and exultation and back to praise. It conveys something of the majesty and glory of the one who is coming, of his movement towards us and of the price that he paid for his victory.

> Lo, he comes with clouds descending, once for favoured sinners slain; thousand thousand saints attending swell the triumph of his train: Alleluia! God appears on earth to reign.

Every eye shall now behold him robed in dreadful majesty; those who set at naught and sold him, pierced and nailed him to the Tree, deeply wailing, shall the true Messiah see.

Those dear tokens of his passion still his dazzling body bears, cause of endless exultation to his ransomed worshippers: with what rapture gaze we on those glorious scars!

Yea, Amen, let all adore thee, high on thine eternal throne; Saviour, take the power and glory, claim the kingdom for thine own: Alleluia! Thou shalt reign, and thou alone.
