

#### Zion Consistory Highlights

The November Consistory meeting was opened with a prayer asking for God's guidance, wisdom, and support.

We were able to reclaim the use of our Sanctuary on Stewardship Sunday, despite the ongoing challenges of COVID-19 and our internet instability. Hallelujah! We were decidedly disappointed (yet not surprised) that we have had to subsequently suspend in-person services and Sunday School due to a surge in the pandemic. Kim Ridenour is continuing to hold Youth Sunday School (and weekly 4-H meetings) via Zoom. Our Sunday Worship Services can be viewed virtually. A weekly Service Summary is mailed to members without internet capability. The Service Summary incorporates the Bulletin, with Pastor Katie's sermon inserted. In this manner, we hope to stay spiritually connected with those who don't have digital access.

Rae Smith and a hardy band of Zion volunteers braved the cold weather to host our Holyween outdoor event. During the course of the evening, 72 hot dogs, bags of chips, water, and gift bags containing candy and Zion refrigerator magnets was distributed to neighborhood children and goblins.

The Soup Kitchen continues to operate on both an eat-in and take out basis.

Mosko Monument Services has initiated resetting and restoring of broken and toppled headstones in our cemetery. The repairs, covered by a Community Foundation Grant, were delayed, but are finally under way.

The Zion Budget Committee, with input from our other committee chairpersons, is in the process of developing our 2021 Annual Budget.

Now that the parking lot construction is complete, we can now look toward subdividing the Parsonage parcel as being separate from the entry/exit driveways and rear aspect of the lot; providing more flexibility for future possible uses of the property.

One day this dark winter of the pandemic will be behind us. We need to trust God in all of this—but God won't mind if we pick up the phone to check on, and to pray for each other.

#### Get Ready...Get Set.....Winter!! A Parish Nurse Note December 2020

Ready or not, here it comes....WINTER. This year has been challenging so far, and my guess is that winter will also require some adapting. However, remembering some health and preparedness tips will make this season easier. With winter comes flu season (on top of CoVid-19.....yikes!). Remember to wash your hands frequently for at least 20 seconds and cover your nose and mouth if you sneeze or cough. STAY HOME IF YOU DON'T FEEL WELL. Get your flu vaccination; it will **not** make you ill and will help lessen your symptoms if you are exposed to the flu. Don't postpone routine vaccinations, exams and screenings. Even though this is a busy season, keeping your screenings on track is important.

Try to manage your stress during the upcoming months. Don't over extend your budget or your calendar with activities (this probably will be a lesser problem this year due to CoVid-19 restrictions). Getting 7-8 hours of sleep daily is a great way to combat stress and stay healthy. Avoid smoking and tobacco use of any kind as well as places where you are exposed to second hand smoke; this can be very detrimental to your health during this time of increased respiratory infections. If consuming alcohol is part of your holidays, be sure to not drink and drive. Reminding others of this is also important. Remember that alcohol can also add lots of extra calories to your diet.

Manage those wonderful holiday treats by including healthy food choices when you can. Eat lots of fruits and vegetables every day- your immune system loves a steady supply of these foods. Limit your intake of most fats, sugar and salt. Use a smaller plate when at a gathering and fill up on healthy foods before eating desserts and high calorie foods. Eat slowly - it takes at least 10 minutes for your brain to tell your stomach that you are full. When preparing foods, avoid cross contamination of uncooked and cooked foods. Be sure to refrigerate temperature sensitive foods promptly.



Pets and children need special care during the holidays. New toys, decorations, seasonal plants, household items, different foods and new surroundings can be dangerous. Cautiously use stoves, candles, space heaters and fireplaces; the majority of house fires occur in the winter. Be sure to review your fire safety plan with your family. Always wear your seat belt and be sure that all passengers in your car do the same. Even a short trip could end in disaster.

Exercise is key to staying healthy, even in winter. Walking is great and outside activities with children are good for all involved. Remember to dress in layers and wear shoes or boots that keep your feet dry. If you prefer inside fitness activities, dance to your favorite music, try yoga or delve into an exercise CD. Adults need at least 2 ½ hours of exercise per week; children and adolescents should have al least one hour of exercise daily.

Finally, keep everything in perspective; remember both the beauty of the winter season as well as the wonderful gift God has given us as we celebrate the coming of his Son! Stay well and active during this special season!


