

As We Gather

Isaiah 13–23 consists of ten sections labeled “Burdens.” Isaiah 19 is the fifth “Burden” in the series. It deals with the future of Egypt. The first half of the chapter proclaims God’s coming judgment against Egypt. God was using ancient Assyria to conquer land after land in order to change the international status quo. No longer would the Gentile nations continue to be autonomous, self-determining and self-oriented. God was in the process of turning them away from themselves and their own wisdom and religions. For what ultimate purpose? To turn them to the God of ancient Israel, the only true God.


Confession and Absolution

Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." ²² So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" ²³ He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said." ²⁴ (Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.) ²⁵ They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" ²⁶ John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know, ²⁷ even he who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." ²⁸ These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.
