Chester/Moriah Associations Marriage

The purpose of examining the possibility of a marriage/ merger between the Moriah and Chester Associations is to accomplish the following:

- 1. Improve the spiritual health of **ALL** the churches of the two associations
- 2. Institute a revitalization process to revitalize the churches by impacting the lostness of their community through the development of spiritually strong disciples.
- 3. Institute a church planting process
- 4. To impact the spiritual lostness of Lancaster and Chester counties

Ongoing discussions are being held between the Marriage/Merger Leadership Teams of the Moriah and Chester Baptist Association. Discussion meetings have also been held with pastors of both associations as well as pastoral prayer meetings.

Starting in January, I will be leading the Chester Association through an adapted version of the Restore Process. The adapted version is called "Reset." There will also be a meeting of the two Marriage/Merger Leadership Teams on January 12 at Richburg First Baptist from noon—1:30 p.m.

It is anticipated that in late Spring or early summer of 2021, there will be a vote by the two associations on whether or not to merge.

Please be praying much about this marriage/merger possibility.

Refocused: A New Way For A New Day Dr. Joe Youngblood

Refocus: A New Way For A New Day is a leadership process that has the primary focus of developing the leadership skills of the senior pastor and is aimed at refocusing the church upon the Great Commission. This leadership process will equip pastors with the skills to lead their lay leaders and churches into a Great Commission culture. A Great Commission church is one that is focused upon impacting the lostness of the community and disciplining the saved for spiritual maturity, service and leadership.

Refocus: A New Way For A New Day is designed to equip a pastor to lead his church through the many changes that have been forced upon the church in the new reality of the corona-virus.

The process will use cohorts, small groups, to examine biblical principles of leadership, current and relevant resources and the best biblical practices of evangelism and discipleship. Two cohorts will be developed. One cohort will meet on the second Thursday of each month and the other will meet on the third Tuesday of each month beginning in February. An Introductory Meeting will be held on Thursday, January 28 at the association office starting at 10:00 am. Eight participants is the maximum number for each cohort. If there is enough interest among the co-vocational pastors, a third cohort will be developed for an evening session.
