

2. The Providence of the Christ, the Wonderful Counselor

God is the great motive-power of all things; he is in everything. Not only did he make all things, but by him all things consist. From all eternity, Christ was the Counselor of his Father with regard to providence—when the first man should be born, when he should wander, and when he should be restored—when the first monarchy should rise, and when its sun should set—where his people should be placed, how long they should be placed, and where they should be moved.

Let us rest assured that he is too good to be unkind, and that in the council of eternity, the best was ordained that could have been ordained—that if you and I had been there, we could not have ordained half so well, but that we should have made ourselves eternal fools by meddling therewith. Rest certain, that in the end we shall see that all was well and must be well for ever. He is "Wonderful, the Counsellor," for he counselled in matters of providence should be moved.³

3. The Sufficiency of the Christ, The Wonderful Counselor

Like the people of God at the end of chapter 8, plunged into darkness and gloom of anguish, thrust into thick darkness, Jesus too was thrust into thick darkness, impenetrable, when the Father turned His face away at the cross.

Jesus has been cut off and disowned so that the plague, every plague of the human heart – whether the guilt of sin or the paralysis of fear or the pain of loss or the gloom of loneliness or the grief of death – every plague of the human heart find in Jesus a Wonderful Counselor who hears with understanding when no one else understands, who loves without reserve when everyone else holds back, who gives grace to pardon and to cleanse and to comfort and to uphold you when every other resource runs dry. * Lighting the Advent Wreath originated in Germany in the nineteenth century, based on a Roman custom of the ceremonial entrance of a ruler to a province or city as his 'advent' (from the Latin adventus: 'arrival'). The wreath consists of four candles placed in the wreath itself and one

candle in the center. One candle is lit the first Sunday of Advent. Two are lit the 2nd Sunday, and so on. Each of the candles has special significance: The first is the Prophecy candle; the second is the Bethlehem candle; the third is the Angels' candle; the 4th is the Shepherds' candle; and the center candle is the Christ candle, lit on Christmas Eve.

Message

The Wonderful Counselor Advent Week 1

Isaiah 9:1–7 (ESV)

But there will be no gloom for her who was in anguish. In the former time he brought into contempt the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the latter time he has made glorious the way of the sea, the land beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the nations. ²The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone. ³You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as they are glad when they divide the spoil. ⁴For the yoke of his burden, and the staff for his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. ⁵For every boot of the tramping warrior in battle tumult and every garment rolled in blood will be burned as fuel for the fire. ⁶For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this.

The Context

In chapter 8 of Isaiah the prophetic pronounces dire predictions of coming suffering for the people of God. "They will look to the earth," Isaiah says, "but behold, distress and darkness, the gloom of anguish, and they will be thrust into thick darkness." It is not a happy picture. But then when chapter 9 opens and it's like the sun coming up. There is a message of coming hope, bright and clear. It's a message with all of it entirely focused on the birth of a baby. "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government shall be upon His shoulders."

Introduction

Why is it that the birth of this child should affect such a great reversal? What is it about this child that makes all the difference, that makes Him the turning point for every human life that trusts in Him?

The four names of Isiah 9:6 are really designed to answer those questions. They tell us who Jesus is and what He's come to do. They tell us why Christmas is really worth celebrating. Each name, each title has two parts – Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace.
