**Discussion/Study Guide for Hearing God's Voice**

We hope this guide will help you go deeper into God's Word and spur you on in obedience to what God is teaching us today. Please feel free to use all or part of it for your group discussion or personal study.

- What are some of the ways that God speaks to us? What are some Bible verses that tell us how He speaks to us? See for example, Psalm 19:1-3.
- Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17. How does Paul describe the Bible? Look up/read this verse in several different translations. What are some of the different words that are used to describe the Bible?
- How do the following verses help us understand what it means that "All Scripture is inspired by God"? 2 Peter 1:21; Hebrews 4:12; Deuteronomy 32:46-47.
- According to 2 Timothy 3:16, how are the Scriptures profitable? In what ways has God used the Bible to do each of these profitable works in your life?
- According to 2 Timothy 3:17, what is the purpose that God intends for the Word of God to accomplish in our lives?
- Read Psalm 1. What benefits are described here for the person who meditates on God's word consistently?
- Read 1 Peter 2:2. What metaphor does Peter use to describe the way we should desire God's word?
- Do you have a plan in place to be reading and studying God's word regularly? If so what is it? Take some time to share your plan or brainstorm a plan with someone else who can help you and whom you can help to stay in God's word regularly.
- Take some time to pray and ask God to help you grow through the grace of Hearing His Voice regularly during these next two months.
