A discussion was had concerning the council members terms of service. There will be openings available for council members to be voted on during our annual meeting set for January 31st, 2021. 
As we close on fiscal year 2020, please consider making a contribution to our roofing project. You will be receiving a letter soon announcing the beginning of a roof fund campaign.


