A DAY IN WORSHIP: Following the Nunc Dimittis, we conclude our services with a prayer and the benediction. The benediction we use is found in Numbers 6:22-27. In that text, God commands Aaron (the first high priest of Israel) to bless the people saying, "The Lord bless you and keep you..." God then gives this promise, "So shall they (the priests) put my name upon the people of Israel, and I will bless them." Therefore, when the pastor offers the blessing, we believe that though the words are spoken by human lips, the blessing is given by God. Thus we begin our service by invoking the great name of our great God (in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit), and we end our service by receiving the blessing of this God, who goes with us into the world and into our daily lives.

HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *Within the Father's House*. This hymn is a commentary on our Gospel reading, where Christ is in the temple conversing with the "doctors of the Law." The hymn proclaims this wonderful truth. Though the doctors of the law are astounded by Jesus' wisdom, they fail to grasp who he truly is. He is the Son of the Father, the incarnate Word of God (verses 2-3). But if these wise and learned men cannot understand who Christ is, then who can? The answer is in verse 4. The secret of the Lord is given to faithful, pondering hearts. It does not matter how much or how little a person knows. It does not matter how much education someone

does or does not have. If she wants to know Christ, then all she must do is ponder Christ's word. He will reveal himself to every faithful heart.

ABOUT THE BULLETIN COVER: Jesus increased in wisdom. In His divine nature, the Son of God has all knowledge and wisdom. He has no need for anyone to teach Him and yet in humility deigns to become a child, taking on our human nature. So, according to His humanity, He grows in wisdom. Jesus has become like us, except without sin in order to redeem the whole of who we are.






