PRAYER TIME

THIS IS YOUR DAILY SCRIPTURE:

2 Chronicles 1:10 (CSB) *Now grant me wisdom and knowledge so that I may lead these people, for who can judge this great people of yours?"*

THIS IS YOUR DAILY PRAYER:

Lord, please grant me wisdom and knowledge so that I may lead my family well. It is only you who knows how to judge my children and spouse. Lord give me your wisdom, love and grace for them.



PARENT PRE-READING:

Proverbs 13:3 CSB *The one who guards his mouth protects his life; the one who opens his lips invites his own ruin.*

CONVERSATION STARTER:

I was reading in Proverbs 13 and it says that the one who opens his lips invites his own ruin. Is there someone in your life right now that it's difficult for you not to speak poorly about or say something rude to them? What could you do to improve this relationship?



WISDOM FOR THE FUTURE

Get 11 envelopes and paper for every month left in this year.

Take sometime and have your family write a letter and some goals for yourself all through the year. Each paper and envelope should be connected to a month for the remainder of the year.

Be specific and be encourage to yourself. Sometimes goals are hard to achieve for the whole year but see if you can go a month at a time.

Each new month open these letters to remind yourself of your new goals and new encouragement for that month.



STARTING QUESTIONS

What is a combination of food that doesn't seem like it goes together but you think is so good?

DEEPENING QUESTION

Why do those two food items not work?

READ THIS TOGETHER

Read together: *James 3:13 Who among you is wise and understanding? By his good conduct he should show that his works are done in the gentleness that comes from wisdom.*

SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

Does gentleness and wisdom seem like a common combination to you? Why or why not?

What about wisdom would produce gentleness in us? Do you think a factor is that wisdom that comes from God would produce humility?

How do you think someone with true Godly wisdom would treat other people? Does this look like Jesus?
