What to Do?

Sadly, our country is turmoil. We, once again, watched unbelievable scenes unfold before our eyes. Many of us are tempted to be carried away in the distress of the moment and the politics of our day. Christian, remember your priorities. Remember your influence. Remember the evangelistic purpose God has given for your life.

In these trying days, we aren't sure what to think or what to say. Perhaps, that is a reminder to be careful what we hear, be careful what we see, and be careful what we say. Christians, remember "Whoever keeps his mouth and his tongue keeps himself out of trouble" (Prov 21:23). Be careful with your thoughts. God said, "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (Phil 4:8).

Continue to focus on God. Isaiah 6:3 reminds us that God is "holy holy holy is the LORD of hosts, the whole earth is full of his glory." Turn away from the spectacles and focus on the Lord. Focus on his glory. The entire universe is "a theater for God's glory." Do not allow anything to rob God of your attention. 

Boo's Belyeu

January 1925 one of the most remarkable feats of all time was accomplished. Nome Alaska had a diphtheria outbreak. The weather made it impossible to fly the medicine to rescue the village. There was no other choice except to dog sled it 674 miles to save the folks of Nome. The most incredible effort was made by 20 mushers and 150 sled dogs, but the greatest of them all was Leonhard Seppala with his lead dog Togo. While all the other mushers traveled between 25 to 50 miles roughly, Seppala and Togo traveled over 260 miles on their leg of the "The Great Race of Mercy." Most of the glory went to a dog named Balto who traveled the last 53 miles. He wasn't even the lead dog. A dog named Fox was the lead dog, but news reporters liked the name Balto better. Did you know there was "fake news" even back then? Ha! How much would we be willing to do to save a group of folks? We actually have the saving medicine the world needs the Gospel of Christ. John 3:16 "For God so loved the world he gave his only begotten son, that whosever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Will we travel the distance, make the effort to save the world?

Live Now To Secure Forever

"Therefore do not worry about tomorrow..." (Matthew 6:34).

A person's life can be divided up into four chunks of time: the past, the present, the future and eternity. The devil draws attention to the past and the future; God draws attention to the present and eternity. Therefore, the devil wants to take our focus off of the present and eternity while God wants us to avoid investing too heavily in the past and the future.

For example, when a person is thinking about becoming a Christian, the devil attacks that thinking in at least two places. First, the past: "I have done too many bad things that God could never forgive me of," and second, the future: "Even if He could forgive me, once I was baptized, I could never live up to the high standard of the Christian life."

God, on the other hand, reinforces truthful thinking in the above scenario by coaching a person to do NOW what will secure him or her for ETERNITY. In the process, of course, God does remedy the guilt of sin (PAST) and also gears the new convert up by prayer, worship, Scripture, fellowship, hope, etc. to be faithful in living out the Christian life (FUTURE).

The plea to live in the present saturates Scripture (see for example Mt. 6:34; 2 Co. 61-2; 2 Pet. 3:11-12).

That does not mean we have no business with the past. There may be a mess to clean up. And it does not mean we have no business with future, because we must plan (see Jas. 4:13-16).

It does mean that we should not waste life fantasizing, "I wish I could go back to yester-day," or "I am waiting for things to be different tomorrow."

Rather, live in the moment. Do what you are supposed to be doing today. Obey God now. Take responsibility for the present. That posture is "Christian" and can secure our eternity.
