- How have you experienced God's generosity? Can you tell a story of God's generosity in your life?
- Read 2 Corinthians 9:8. According to this verse what is God able to do? How would you define God's grace? What is the purpose of God giving us all grace?
- Read 1 Chronicles 29:12-14. Where do wealth and honor come from? Do you consider yourself to be wealthy? Why or why not?
- What should our response to God be for the wealth that we have?
- From where does everything come? Who really owns our stuff?
- How does this effect the way you view your finances? Your home? Your children? Your present and future experiences?
- Read Luke 12:13-15. What was the question asked of Jesus?
- How does Jesus respond to the man?
- What does Jesus say we should watch out for?
- How would you define greed?
- Note the personal pronouns that are used by the man in the parable. What are they? What does this tell you about the man's heart?
- Retell the story that Jesus told to emphasize His point in your own words and emphasize the pronouns as you think the man would have said them.
- How does God respond to the man in the parable?
- According to Jesus, who does this parable apply to? Why does Jesus call this man a fool?
- How would understanding that we are all managers of what God owns changed the way the parable would be told?
- Are there areas in your life where you're acting as an owner rather than a manager? What changes can you make or should you make?
