BAPTISMAL REMEMBRANCE: In place of our children's message at Peace Lutheran, we will be having a baptismal remembrance. This is a simple rite where the pastor uses water from the font to mark the children on their foreheads and on their hearts with the sign of the cross. This sign was first placed on them at their baptism. By marking them again, the pastor is reminding them that they were claimed by Christ, and that they are now members of God's family.

HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light*. We have used this as a baptismal hymn in the most recent baptisms at Peace. This short, simple hymn is easy for all people to sing and it summarizes the entire Christian life. In the first stanza, we express our desire to walk as children of the light. This reminds us of our baptism, where we received a baptismal candle to show us that we have received Christ, the light of the world. The second stanza places us on a journey. We are walking toward God, our heavenly Father, and we pray that Christ, the true sun of righteousness, would light our path. The third stanza places us at our destination, in the presence and joy of Jesus. Use this hymn to reflect on your own baptism. You have received Christ; you are on a journey toward God, and you will soon reach your destination, the joy of Jesus.

ABOUT THE BULLETIN COVER: The voice from heaven reveals that Jesus is the chosen and beloved Son of God. According to human thinking, it seems unlikely that

Jesus would come to John to be baptized. Yet He has come to be baptized, counted among sinners, in order to redeem sinners. He counts Himself among us. In our baptism, we are united to His death and resurrection and so receive forgiveness for our sins.
