"Always" and "Anyone"

"I want you to live a provocative life – a life of service and kindness, a life of joy and peace in believing the Gospel, a life that is zealous for doing good, that turns away from evil, that seeks peace and pursues us. I want you to live a life of Christlikeness that is so provocative that the people who know you can't help but ask, 'What in the world is going on with you? Why are you the way you are?"

Have a Good Conscience

1 Peter 3:16–17 (ESV)

having a good conscience, so that, when you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil.

If you have a good conscience, it will be telling you that all is well. If you have an evil conscience, it will be reminding you that all is not well because there is sin in your life. And what Peter is saying is live with a clear conscience, a conscience that doesn't condemn you so that when you face criticism, when you face hostility, when you face persecution you don't feel any guilt.

What are our defenses against the world's hostility?

Christians who suffer for doing good because the Lord wills it for a season find in their trials opportunity to make much of Christ, to show the world, "As I pass through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil for the Lord is with me and His rod and His staff, they comfort me. I have a Savior who is more than enough for every trial through which I may pass." We get to display His sufficiency in our sufferings.⁴

A Final Word

God will get His work done through weak, sinful, repentance, believing Christians who strive, clinging to Jesus Christ, to obey His commandments. God is going to do marvelous things – that's what Peter is saying – marvelous things through our witness for His own great glory. So hear His call. Don't flee back into the Christian ghettos we build for ourselves as a way to maintain our sense of security, but instead begin to live with an outward face. Turn toward your neighbor, your colleague, your friend, with good news.

You will be "blessed"

If some of you per chance should suffer for the sake of righteousness ... that means upright godly behavior ... don't be surprised and don't be fearful, you are blessed Let's not be naive, he says. Some of his readers were already beginning to suffer for Christ and he wants us to be prepared when opposition comes. If you suffer for righteousness sake you are blessed.

The Spirit of glory and of God will rest on you. God will have a purpose in it all should it happen ... it may happen.

1 Peter 2:21-23 (ESV)

For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in his steps. ²²He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. ²³When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly.

There will be points at which our society will not tolerate even a good life. They will not tolerate a righteous man or a righteous woman. The very presence of holy virtue will irritate them to the point that they will have to act aggressively against you. But, says Peter, when we suffer for what is right, we are blessed. Literally it says, even if you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, blessed ... blessed. Almost like an exclamation.

Have No Fear

"Have no fear of them, nor be troubled but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy,"

To honor Christ is to set him apart as sacred in your hearts as Lord. It's an awareness that Jesus is King. "I am His and He is mine. I have been mastered by Him. I am not my own. I have been bought at a price. And so what I say and where I go and how I live are no longer up to me. I am ruled by King Jesus and I will fight the fear of man in my heart by proclaiming to myself over and over again the fear of the Lord that is the beginning of wisdom." David Strain

Be a Christian who has pliability in suffering.

When you have your mind and your heart set on earthly things, when you're preoccupied with possessions and pleasures and ease and comfort and popularity, then you're going to be really be threatened. But if your focus is right and you understand God has honored you highly by the suffering and will give you a greater weight of glory in the future, then you can count it all joy when you fall into various trials, as James said.³

Always Ready to Give an Answer

1 Peter 3:13–17

Introduction

Christians everywhere will face increasing hostility, both from civil authorities and from unbelievers at the personal level. This passage speaks to all who would live godly lives in the midst of a hostile, ungodly culture. The apostle Peter gives us principles believers need to embrace to equip and defend themselves against the threats of an unbelieving, hostile world: a passion for goodness, a willingness to suffer—for wrong and for right, a devotion to Christ, a readiness to defend the faith, and a pure conscience. ¹

How then are we to live? Have a Reasonable Expectation

1 Peter 3:13 (ESV)

Now who is there to harm you if you are zealous for what is good?

Peter says, "You be a zealot, only you be a zealot for what is good. You have such a passion for goodness, for kindness, for tenderness, for mercy, for love, for philanthropy that the world will have a great difficulty persecuting you.

This is not a guaranteed promise that if you do good you won't be **persecuted; it simply makes it all the more difficult to do**. We are to have a passion for doing what is good. Jesus had that passion. Jesus did good and only good. He is our model. And yet Jesus Himself also ultimately was killed by a hostile world.

Be Prepared

1 Peter 3:14-15 (ESV)

But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, ¹⁵but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect,

There will be times when those who do good suffer. But, he says, even if you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, you're blessed. The little phrase "but even if" could be translated "per chance" or "contrary to what is expected," even if it per chance should happen that you suffer for the sake of righteousness, you're blessed.²
