The Spoils of War

To the winner go the spoils. On Super Bowl Sunday we will see one team emerge with victory and the Super Bowl trophy...and a lot of money. To the winner goes the spoils of war. We would do well to remember the spoils of Christ's victory over sin and death. Not only has he won a people "from every tribe and language and people and nation" (Rev 5:9), but he has shared those blessings with his church as Paul wrote, "When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men" (Eph 4:8; cited from Ps 68:18).

Romans 8:29-30 describes those treasures with these words, "For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified." These are the "spoils of war" which Jesus has shared with us. God won those treasures for us when "He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him" (Col 2:15). The enemies were "put aside" as they were "nailed to the cross" (Col 2:14). As we are "brought forth" from sin "of his own will...by the word of truth" (Jas 1:18), we are brought into a new relationship with God in which we are able to enjoy him and the blessings which he bestows upon us richly.

Christ has defeated sin, death, and Satan. The victory is His. He shares his treasures with his people. We get to enjoy his treasures, and best of all, we get to enjoy Him.



Freed Hardeman University annual Bible Lectureship starts February 7th. It will be online this year due to Covid concerns. Freed Hardeman's 1st Bible Lectureship happened in 1926. It was called the "Preacher's Course" and lasted a month. In the 1940's it was reduced to 2 weeks. Since 1961 it has been the first full week of February. It was in the 1960's missionary updates and news of missionaries started being presented. A workshop for Bible teachers appeared in the 1958 lectures. The comment of one visitor in 1954 seemed to express the feelings of most that were present: "Like a tired and thirsty traveler reaching an oasis, so I have been impressed with the refreshment of the good things offered here." This is still true today a refreshing of spirit and encouragement of heart. Psa. 23:3 "He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake." 1st Thess. 5:11 "Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing." The topic this year is Ecclesiastes "Finding Meaning in a Meaningless World." I hope you can find time to participate.
