Imitating The Master

You have heard it said that imitation is the greatest form of flattery. At the heart of that statement, idea, is the ancient practice of apprenticeship. An apprentice works alongside the master, imitating the master and learning from the master the skills necessary for the trade. When Jesus called his disciples, they began an apprenticeship that enabled them to learn the skills necessary to represent God's vision for God's world. We have a fancy word for that in the church: discipleship.

Discipleship assumes that we are students of the teacher, and as students we walk side by side with our Teacher, listening and watching him as he teaches through his words and actions. For us, however, as we learn what our Teacher desiares to teach us, and we imitate him in his words and actions, we are doing that not out of a desire to flatter him, but out of the desire to be more like him. Discipleship. Apprenticeship. Imitating the Master, Jesus the Christ.

The season of Lent is a time that we, as a church, intentionally engage in the practices that help us deepen our relationship with Jesus; the spiritual practices of this apprenticeship that we are on. There is much that we can learn from the scriptures to teach us what this apprenticeship looks like, this discipleship looks like. I found a section in Romans that gives concise instructions for Jesus' disciples, and I think it is helpful for us as we enter into the season Lent:

- Let love be genuine
- Hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good
- Love one another with mutual affection
- Outdo one another in showing honor
- Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord
- Rejoice in hope
- Be patient in suffering
- Persevere in prayer
- Contribute to the needs of the saints
- Extend hospitality to strangers
- Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them
- Rejoice with those who rejoice
- Weep with those who weep
- Live in harmony with one another
- Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly
- Do not claim to be wiser than you are
- Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all
- If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all

That's a pretty great list from Romans 12:9-18, and it goes on. Reread that list and see in it the qualities of our Master, Christ Jesus. Then reread the list again and see in it a blueprint for you and I to faithfully follow Christ and represent God's vision for God's world.

Christ Jesus has called all of us to follow him, and where he goes is toward the full richness of life under the reign of God, eternal life, abundant life, true life.

The church council held its monthly meeting January 12th in the fellowship hall.

Pastor reported that there has been requests for wine to again be part of the sacrament of communion and the council agreed. A safe way for distribution will be adopted.

The final job description for the position of Administrative Assistant was approved with the only change being the approximate weekly hours being raised from 10 to 15. It was also decided to have a paid part time position of Custodian.

Discussion turned to the annual meeting and it was decided to hold the meeting immediately following the Sunday service on February 7th. The agenda was discussed and approved and the budget, presented by the Finance committee, was also approved.

A special meeting of the council was held on January 19th. The main topics of the meeting included the future of Pastoral care for First Lutheran and the Administrative Assistant position. Pastor Rasner laid out several options for Pastoral care and the council will continue discussion of the options. It was decided to place ads in the Reporter again and post the position with the Iron County Economic Chamber Alliance for the Administrative position. The council approved the purchase of three video monitors to aid in the monitoring of the live feed to Facebook and control the in-church video stream and displays. A line item for the 2021 budget was also added for Technology.
