HYMN OF THE DAY: *Epiphany* means to show forth or to manifest. During the season of epiphany, our gospel lessons focus on the ways that Jesus manifested (showed forth) his true identity as God and Savior. Our hymn of the day, *Songs of Thankfulness and Praise*, was written to summarize the season of epiphany as a reminder of the ways in which Jesus manifested himself on earth during his earthly ministry. Thus, we sing about how he was manifest "in making whole, palsied limbs and fainting soul." And how he was manifest "in valiant fight, quelling all the devil's might," a phrase which points to our Gospel lesson for today. We end by praying that he would manifest himself in his church today through his holy Word, that we might be ready for his final manifestation in glory on the last day.

**ABOUT THE BULLETIN COVER:** Jesus taught with authority. The leadership did not know what to do because they had never heard anyone teach like this before. "He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey Him" (Mark 1:27). In a world filled with inert opinions about spiritual matters, we need the authoritative teaching from


