## God's Everyday Grace Discussion/Study Guide for Speaking God's Language

- Every disciple of Jesus has a role to play in fulfilling the Great Commission. Of the 3 following options which ones are you involved in, Going, Giving, and/or Praying? In what ways?
- Read Philippians 4:10-20. According to verse 11 what has Paul learned that has made him not anxious about his needs?
- According to verse 12-13, what makes it possible for Paul to be content?
- How does putting verse 13 in its context, help us understand its true meaning? Have you ever seen or heard this verse used inappropriately? How?
- In verse 17, what is Paul seeking more than the financial gifts from the Philippian church?
- How does giving to a missionary like Paul, or like the Lelands, benefit the people who give?
- What is the promise that Paul proclaims in verse 19? How does this encourage you? How should this encourage the Lelands as they go to Thailand? How should this encourage us as a church as we partner in sending them to Thailand?
- How do these two verses, 4:13 & 4:19, help you in the challenges you are facing as a disciple of Jesus? In what areas do you need to have the strength to be content and the confidence that God will supply what you need?
- o Take some time to pray about these needs.
- Ask God to show you how you can be more involved in being a part of fulfilling the Great Commission to reach the world with the gospel of Jesus.
