Morning Worship Sermon Outline

Text: I Corinthians 15:1-23

Title: The Resurrection of the Body II

Introduction

- I. There is a direct connection between the bodily resurrection of every believer in Christ and the bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ.
 - A. Does it really matter whether Christ rose bodily from the grave? 'She was absolutely *sure* that one must remain unsure'
 - B. There is a legal, covenantal and living connection between Christ Jesus as the Representative and Living Head of His body united to Him by the Spirit and faith in life, and our entire salvation and the consummate resurrection of the body.
- II. The resurrection is the great anticipated hope of every child of God.
- III. There shall be a resurrection both of the just/righteous and the unjust/unrighteous.
 - A. The Scriptures clearly reveal that there shall be a resurrection.
 - B. How do you respond to the reality of the resurrection?
