## From the Pastor's Desk

#### Pressing On When Facing Difficulties

Almost everyone will admit that this past year has been their most difficult year. Ever. By far! Twelve months ago we had heard about COVID-19 and that it was potentially serious. Three weeks later, the entire world shut down for months. We are still not out of the woods yet as we all experience this worldwide coronavirus pandemic.

So, how does one press on when facing difficulties? In addition to the coronavirus pandemic, these difficulties may include stresses, disruptions, and failures.

James, the brother of our Lord Jesus, knew about difficulty. However, his difficulty also included persecution for faith in Jesus. James gives some counsel about how to press on when facing difficulties.

First, our difficulties will not last. In light of eternity, our difficulties are very short in duration. James writes, "As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord" (James 5:10). The prophets endured tremendous difficulties because they knew it was only temporary. When facing difficulties, focus on the eternal. Keep in mind that our difficulties will not last forever.

Second, God will use our difficulties. James writes, "for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing" (James 1:3-4). Difficulties often catch us by surprise. But God allows them into our lives so that we might become "perfect and complete, lacking in nothing." Someone once said, "God is not as concerned about our comfort as he is about our character." He uses our difficulties to shape our character to become more like Christ.

Third, getting angry will not help. When we go through difficulties, it is easy to get angry with others. But it does not help. James writes, "Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God" (James 1:19-20). One cannot be angry and righteous at the same time.

Fourth, trusting God pleases him. "and the Scripture was fulfilled that says, 'Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness'—and he was called a friend of God" (James 2:23). Abraham trusted God even when he had no idea how God would fulfill the promise (of a son) to him. God considered Abraham a friend because Abraham trusted God's word, even when he had no concrete evidence to do so. We will please God when we trust him and rely completely on his word when facing difficulties.

Fifth, Jesus is coming back. James writes, "You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand" (James 5:8). No one knows when Jesus will return. But when he returns, he will right all wrongs. He will put all our difficulties behind us and we shall be glad that we remained faithful to him.

And finally, this is not the end of the story. When we read a complex story, it seems confusing and hard to follow. But, when we get to the end of the story and all of the tensions are resolved, we appreciate the story. When Job lost his health, his children, and his wealth, he had no idea how it would all turn out. But God did. James writes, "Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful" (James 5:11). God cared about every detail of Job's life. And he cares about every detail of your life and my life.

So, when you face difficulties in your life, press on while keeping these truths from James in mind.

We were scheduled to start at approximately 7:00 p.m. but we actually started the first game at 7:20 p.m.. We decided to split the teams by drawing numbers, numbers 1 through 12, and thus the 3 teams were formed. It was an enjoyable night of bowling. And adding to the fun were pizza and beverages which were provided for all to enjoy. The bowling alley was very modern with illuminated bowling pins and video screens for viewing at the end of the alleys.

– Assistant Webmaster needed for new TBPC website going live in January. We have simplified our website, making it easier to update and manage. The website is complete, but we are looking for someone to help maintain it. This would involve weekly/monthly document uploads and new or updated pages as needed. No experience necessary.

The position would require approx. 20 minutes per week. Training will be provided.

#### **Help Needed on Sundays!**

- **AV TEAM** needs soundboard operators and someone to run the Worship Service slides one Sunday per Month. No experience needed we will train you. If you can run PowerPoint slides, you can run the Sunday Service slides!
- Nursery attendants needed one Sunday per month. Childcare training will be provided if not already completed.

- **Hospitality Coordinator** needed. This is a leadership position. The coordinator has general oversight of all hospitality events and oversees kitchen management: supplies, organization, equipment, laundry, frozen food storage, and writing kitchen procedures as needed. The coordinator also recruits and schedules the refreshment team for after-church fellowship.
- **Hospitality Refreshment Team Members** needed one Sunday per month. Several areas of need are involved in this position: 1. Responsibility for preparing coffee at 10:00 a.m. for after church fellowship. 2. Serving coffee during the after church fellowship and clean up afterwards. Both positions would involve only one Sunday per month.

They decorated the Youth Room in red and white in honor of Valentine's Day and had a lovely refreshment table arranged. What a sweet gathering emphasizing friendship and fellowship. The program was based on Choosing Gratitude, "Your Journey to Joy," a book authored by Nancy Leigh DeMoss.

Marianne Cali led the group in prayer, followed by Suzanne Swenson recognizing Marianne for her having mentored not only Suzanne but others as well. Kelly presented Marianne with a lovely bouquet of Valentine flowers. Marianne is relocating in March to Lakeland, Florida to be closer to family.

Ashley Powe provided the devotion basing her comments on two Scriptures, 1 John 3:17-18 and 1 Timothy 5:8. "But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for members of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever" (1 John 3:17-18). "But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in-deed and in truth" (1 Timothy 5:8).

Kelly introduced the spirit of gratitude by sharing with us a review written by June Kezziah of Stafford, Virginia. How do we choose to be grateful? The author highlights two questions on the back cover. They are:

- What if we responded with worship instead of protesting or whining?
- What if we moved beyond an occasional "thank you" to cultivate a lifestyle of appreciating God's goodness every day of our lives—despite the circumstances?

The book explores all the ways we can be grateful, but it goes one step further and makes sure we understand that gratitude is not really about just saying "thank you" all the time—it's about having a heart that seeks to appreciate the seemingly mundane, the things that are not necessarily things you would be thankful for otherwise, but those things that make life easier/better/more fun/happier/etc./etc. It made me think about the things I'm grateful for, and how often I am grateful for big things—but isn't life filled up with those little things, small moments, "trivial" things? Shouldn't I be grateful for those as well?

The author, Nancy Leigh DeMoss, established that gratitude is the pure, appropriate response to the saving and keeping grace of God. Why choose gratitude over ingratitude? Ms. DeMoss provides us with eight reasons:

- Gratitude is a matter of obedience.
- Gratitude draws us close.
- Gratitude is a sure path to peace.
- Gratitude is a gauge of the heart.
- Gratitude is the will of God.
- Gratitude is an evidence of being filled with the Spirit.
- Gratitude reflects Jesus' heart.
- Gratitude gets us ready for heaven.
