It's not as big as I wanted, but it's less then ten years old and has a two year warranty that comes with it. Because of the holidays here in Japan, we probably will not get the van until the second week of January, but we are so grateful and we know our military members will be too.

We are currently meeting in our house. To grow and to continue reaching out to the community, we desperately needed a building. My plan was to contact the owner of the building that is located next door to our house upon our return to Okinawa. We rented the building before and it proved to be a huge blessing.

We arrived back on island on Friday and the next day, Saturday, the landlord was waiting at the building next door. She wanted to know if we would like to rent the building again. She had put a small business in the building and is now moving it to a better location. This will allow us to have our auditorium and nursery next door and Sunday School rooms in our house. Praise God for His provision!! Our first service in this building will be the first Sunday in January!

One of our LBC Alumni families contacted us concerning a couple coming that was going to be stationed here on Okinawa through the Marine Corps. Deb and Steve who were our first members here at LBC, and now live in the states, knew this young couple from a prior assignment here and found out they would need help upon arrival because they were bringing two dogs. The next Sunday night around 11:00pm, we were at the airport to help pick up "Jo and Korey." Korey rode with a co-worker and they took the dogs to the kennel on Kadena Air Base. Jo, his wife, rode with Susan and I to the Air Force Lodge. How exciting it was when they visited the following Sunday to attend church. It was a special Sunday. We had a Christmas fellowship where we decorated cookies and made cookie trays with tracts included, and took them to our Japanese neighbors. We even sang to them.

We want to say a special thank you to all of our new supporting churches. Your prayers and support will help us continue the work God has called us to here in Okinawa. Lives are being changed and Christians are growing in the Lord.

2019 will be a great year because of ALL of our praying partners and supporters.
