Hello Friends,

Thank you for your prayers for our transition to the mission field. Things are going a little smoother now, but we are not out of the woods yet, I don't imagine. There have been several things accomplished with our immigration status. We are now registered as residents of Amsterdam, we have opened a bank account, and we have talked with the KvK (Chamber of Commerce) about registering a church here. Part of the KvK registration requires us to have a space outside of our home to hold services. (We are trying to do everything according to their law {Romans 13:1}). This is due to the treatment of the Jews before and during World War II. Before we arrived here, it was my understanding you could register a church in your home, but like much of the other information I had received, that was not correct. So, we have made contact with a company that rents office space. We have a good location picked out, just outside the city, but close enough that it won't be difficult for people to get there. It is right on a major Metro line and right on a bus stop. The nice part is, it is right about the price we have budgeted for it. Praise the Lord! Next week, we have another meeting with the Gemeente (city government) to turn in more documents that we had expressed shipped back from the States. One more step in the right direction.


Over the last month we have been very active in street work. We met a young man from Ireland a few weeks ago in the city when we got off a tram. He currently lives in The Hague, but has a burden, like us, for Amsterdam. We have been meeting up with him and preaching and passing out tracts every week. Last week a man named Gerard walked up and asked if he could help us, he was a little timid at first, but as I was preaching he got warmed up a little bit and walked right out in the middle of the sidewalk and started passing out tracts. We also made contact with a young man named Joel. He was raised under some real heresy and I spent quite some time talking and praying with him. We have had some email contact, but I would really like to get him in discipleship. Pray for that! We met with some folks in other cities recently as well. I mentioned going to Leeuwarden last month. That went well, even though it was real cold. Many heard shoppers at the street market heard the word preached and took tracts. We also went to Nijmegen to tract with our friend Erik, we put the gospel in the hands of many people there.

We still need prayer for the immigration process. Pray for Gerard, Joel, and our realtor Boy. Boy said he was raised Catholic but is now atheist. I was able to give him my testimony and give him the plan of salvation, Lisa also gave him a tract. I hope to have more opportunity to talk with him. Please pray for a street preachers meeting coming up soon. Pray for our street ministry in Amsterdam and all the tracts that have been distributed. Pray for souls to be saved here.

Greetings from Brazil.

We started off the New Year with holding a Vacation Bible School at the church in Vargem Grande. The theme was "A Fantastic Adventure - The Time Tunnel". Although we did not have the attendance we would have liked to have seen we still had some children visit the church for the first time. We even had a prospective new family attend the graduation exercise in the morning church service; however we shortly thereafter learned that they were in the process of moving to a city in Northern Brasil 2,500 miles away. At least we were able to present the Gospel to them. The following week we helped out the church in Jd. Varginha with their VBS using the same theme. They too had some first time visitors attend.

We would ask that you place Pr. Jose Vicente Romano on your prayer list. Early last year a goiter was discovered growing in his neck, but due to priority of other patients his treatment and/or surgery has been constantly put off or pushed back. As such it has continued to grow in size and is very noticeable. When it finally appeared that the surgery would be scheduled the surgeon broke his arm. This week he will be consulting with a new doctor who has just come to the area who also does this type of surgery. Please pray for Pr. Vicente that this surgery can be done quickly.

In February we held several Cottage Prayer meetings at the church in the homes of various members. One was a service of thanksgiving to God for the tremendous answer to prayer that He provided whereas the other was asking for protection, guidance and wisdom of a son the was leaving home again to return to college in southern Brasil. Speaking of returning to classes, On March 5th classes begin again at the Bible Institute where I teach the Life of Christ. I would ask that you not only pray for the returning students but also the new ones that will have to get used to my American accent in teaching in Portuguese so as that they can understand me while I am teaching.

Once again, thank you for your faithfulness in supporting us financially and/or prayerfully through the years. The churches in Jardim Varginha and Vargem Grande are here today because you prayed and invested in God's work. Please continue to pray with us that we will continue to see an even greater Harvest of souls for the honor and glory of our Lord Jesus Christ in 2018.
