The last few months of the year bring many family holidays and some are desperately missing home. Unfortunately they find solace in things that do not provide lasting comfort. With this comes hurt and heartache. We witness this first hand and our souls ache for these hurting people. Their decisions have lasting consequences and unfortunately many times those consequences are rather severe. This is just such the case for a young Marine we found passed out on our way to Sunday morning services. He was seeking comfort in a bottle and now is serving time in the brig. I beg you to

strengthen your resolve to lift these service men and women before the Lord as they battle the temptations of Satan. These people need the Lord and it is our desire to introduce them to Him.

November brought with it a vast array of emotional events. First, my wife and I celebrated our 25th wedding anniversary on the 12th. This would obviously cause us to incur additional medical costs and could take time away from the ministry. We would be humbled for you to lift this before our Heavenly Father and trust that He will provide for my speedy recovery.

Finally, we will be heading back to the States in January to visit Drake as he graduates from boot camp. There is a possibility that we can visit some of you during that time. We will be in Washington, Texas, Illinois,

and Missouri. I will be contacting each of our supporting churches in these areas to schedule a good time to update you on the ministry. Thank you again for your faithfulness to our Father in the place He has called you to minister. God bless you as you continue to serve Him during the next few months.
