Third Week of Lent – Looking forward to St Joseph

One hundred and fifty years ago Pope Pius IX proclaimed St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark this important anniversary Pope Francis has declared 2021 to be a "Year of Joseph". In his letter *Patris Corde* ("With a father's heart") he offers some intimate reflections on St Joseph as one very close to our human experience, and I would encourage you to use them in your prayer and Lenten reading.

Pope Francis writes that his "desire to do so increased during these months of pandemic, when we experienced, amid the crisis, how our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked. People who do not appear in newspaper and magazine headlines, or on the latest television show, yet in these very days are surely shaping the decisive events of our history. Doctors, nurses, storekeepers and supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caregivers, transport workers, men and women working to provide essential services and public safety, volunteers, priests, men and women religious, and so very many others. They understood that no one is saved alone... How many people daily exercise patience and offer hope, taking care to spread not panic, but shared responsibility. How many fathers, mothers, grandparents and teachers are showing our children, in small everyday ways, how to accept and deal with a crisis by adjusting their routines, looking ahead and encouraging the practice of prayer. How many are praying, making sacrifices and interceding for the good of all'. Each of us can discover in Joseph – the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

We are blessed in having one of our churches dedicated to St Joseph. As we prepare to keep his feast on 19th March, I would like to encourage you to deepen your understanding of him and, through prayer, to experience his fatherly care.

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life.

Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

Coming out of Lockdown

As we slowly come out of lockdown we will shift the balance of parish activities towards more opportunities to gather in person.

Please note that it is not until 29th March that we will be able to gather in small groups outside (rule of 6), so we will be very careful while making the most of the opportunity to celebrate the liturgy together. We should be able to do a bit more once we reach stage 3, including increasing capacity from the current 16 households (with 2m distancing).

In response to the wishes of a significant number of people the online Liturgy of the Word will continue on Sundays at 10.30am for at least the next few weeks.

If all goes well, from **28th March** the 9.00am Mass will move back to **Farncombe**.
