Fourth 'Lætare' Sunday of Lent

The reference in today's Gospel to the serpent in the wilderness is a direct reference to an episode in book of Numbers (21:4-9) in which the Israelites grumbled against God and were visited by deadly serpents as a result. God has Moses fashion a fiery serpent and place it on a standard and the people are saved by looking up at it. This may be a familiar image – it is the origin of the sign often attached to medical and pharmaceutical organisations and services. I find it interesting to ponder the connection between this medicine which God gave to Moses and the way in which we are looking at pharmaceuticals as our way out of the current pandemic.

Over the centuries Christians have looked to the cross of Christ as their sign of hope and the pledge of their salvation. But the crosses they have gazed upon have been quite varied. In the earlier centuries the cross did not have a corpus (figure of Christ) but was bejewelled instead. Later on, a figure in agony evoked the suffering of the cross and the price of our salvation. At other times a fully naked Christ came to stand as a visual reminder of his humanity, and a figure in priestly vestments spoke of his work as the mediator between God and man.

For the many centuries in which sacramental communion (i.e. receiving Holy Communion as we know it) was infrequent the faithful were nourished by their sense of communion through seeing. The host was lifted high and in the light provided by the new gothic architecture they knew the presence of God and his saving grace. Churches were built as places in which the host in the monstrance could be seen. (St Edmund's follows this convention, with the 'throne' in the centre of the reredos on which the cross sits today.)

It is right that we look forward to being able to receive holy communion regularly under the form of bread and wine. However, I wonder if the fast that we have experienced over much of this last year might have allowed us to experience that simply praying silently before the tabernacle or the blessed sacrament exposed in a monstrance – looking upon the pledge of God's love – is itself a rich source of grace and one of those privileged moments in which we can meet Jesus Christ who reveals the fullness of God's love for each one of us.

Mass Responses for the Fourth Sunday of Lent

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

PSALM RESPONSE: O let my tongue cleave to my mouth if I remember you not!

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Glory and praise to you, O Christ! God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son: everyone who believes in him has eternal life. Glory and praise to you, O Christ!

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Jerusalem is built as a city bonded as one together. It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord, to praise the name of the Lord.

Feasts in March Over the next two weeks we keep the Solemnities of the Anniversary of the Dedication of our church in Milford (18th), St Joseph (19th) and the Annunciation (25th). There is unlikely to be as much pressure for space on the other days.

Coming out of Lockdown Please note that it is not until 29th March that we will be able to gather in small groups outside (rule of 6), so as we slowly come out of lockdown we will be very careful while making the most of the opportunity to celebrate the liturgy together. We should be able to do a bit more once we reach stage 3 and can increase capacity from 16 households (with 2m distancing).

Meanwhile the **online Liturgy of the Word** will continue on Sundays at 10.30am for the next few weeks, and we hope the **9.00am Mass** returns to Farncombe on 28th March.
