

#### 2. We Have Good Resources to not be in Turmoil.

"If you had known me, you would have known my Father also You trust in God; trust also in me"

Jesus is saying, "If by daily listening to Me and thinking over My words and My works you had learned to know Me, you would have known My Father also." Maybe Jesus would tell us the same thing. "If you had taken the time to think through what I am saying and think through the works that I am doing, you would have known Me." Our faith suffers because of it. The strength of our faith, the health of our faith, suffers because of it.

3. We have the Father, Son, and the Spirit so don't be in turmoil. "From now on, you have seen Him. You do know Him and you have seen Him."

Jesus knows, as they do not but they will discover quickly, a new period begins even with the events of the night that they are in. He knows that they will see the Father give His Son over to His enemies and to death. He knows that they will see the Father raise Him from the dead and seat Him at His right hand. They will see Jesus send His Spirit to indwell His people beginning with this very group of men, this very group of disciples, and they will know the Father as never before. In all that is to come, these disciples will be able to say, "We have seen the Father." A wealth of comfort is soon to come their way, though much more grief and much more heartache. But Jesus bounds that for them by saying, "From now on, you do know Him and you have seen Him." They'll think about those words in the days to come more deeply and more profoundly.

#### **Summary**

Let not your heart be troubled, because there's a place for you in my Father's house. And don't let your heart be troubled, because Jesus prepared the place for you. He opened the way. He is the way. Remember to not let your heart be troubled, because Jesus himself *is* your dwelling place and he will come and take you to himself. And finally, don't let your heart be troubled, because Jesus and the Father are one, so that if have Jesus you have the Father.

troubled minds. Such faith would dispel the nagging suspicions that they were being abandoned. Indeed, how could men who had every reason to trust in Jesus as they trusted in God stoop to think that his departure was not for their ultimate good?<sup>3</sup>

### b. Don't be troubled, but trust me, because I myself am going to make ready the place of dwelling with God.

Verses 2–3a: "In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you...

The faith of those first believers was stable and strong in proportion as it rested in Jesus as in God, believing that Jesus' departure was a return to his Father's presence, a return which itself opened up the Father's house to them.

The faith of believers at the end of the twentieth century will be stable and strong in proportion as it rests in Jesus as in God, believing that Jesus' departure via the cross, now an event almost two thousand years in the past, was his triumphant return to the Father, and the means by which we too need never fear abandonment.

#### c. Don't be troubled, but trust me, because I will take you to myself, and I will get you there.

Verse 3: "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also."

One of the most important phrases in this passage: I will take you to myself. This shifts the focus from a place to a person. Where Jesus is, there is heaven. What is the essence of heaven? The immediate presence of Jesus. So when he says, "I go to prepare a place for you," isn't the essence of what he is saying: I go this night through death for you, and I go Easter Sunday morning out of death for you, so that I myself might be your living dwelling place.

## d. I am the Way, and The Truth, and the Life

"And you know the way to where I am going." 5 Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" 6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

Peter and the other disciples, and you and I, do not need to have an untrusting turmoil of soul that we are imperfect, wrath-deserving, unworthy followers of Jesus. Our sin does not mean that our place in God's household will be unavailable, or unsuitable. Because Jesus, this night, goes to purchase our forgiveness and become the way to the Father. He makes our room not only available, but suitable and certain for his redeemed sheep. So let not your hearts be troubled. Trust me.

## Farewell Discourse of Jesus Don't Be Troubled

John 14:1-7 (ESV)

"Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. <sup>2</sup>In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? <sup>3</sup>And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. <sup>4</sup>And you know the way to where I am going." <sup>5</sup>Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" <sup>6</sup>Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. <sup>7</sup>If you had known me, you would have known my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

#### What are we to do with despair?

Life in this fallen, sin-cursed world is packed with trouble and trials. Instead of pretending they do not exist, Scripture faces the hardships of life directly.

The Gospel of John and this passage in particular is **very practical**. **Very relevant** to one of the most common struggles we have, namely, the tendency to have a very godless heart-turmoil. This is a fretful failure to trust God fully for the problem we are facing. At first it may look like Jesus is addressing an anxiety that isn't the one you're dealing with. But hang on, because Jesus takes a surprising turn in this story.<sup>1</sup>

#### 1. We have Good Reason Not to Be Troubled.

Christians are realists. They are realists about all life's problems. And at the same time Christians are realists about the power of God and his promises. And this means that although there is cause to be troubled, nevertheless, there is even greater cause not to be.<sup>2</sup>

The disciples did not really doubt that God would take care of them in some far off, general sense. But they did not understand how Jesus could go, how he could apparently be abandoning them.

#### 4 Reasons to Not Be Troubled

a. Don't be troubled, but trust me, because my Father has many rooms in his house and each of you will have one.

Verse 2: "In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? <sup>3</sup>And if I go and prepare a place for you ..." (John 14:2–3). Jesus assures his disciples that his departure is for the purpose of establishing for them permanent dwelling places in the very presence of God. That is the truth about his leaving. If believed, their faith would triumph over their doubts and their
