When I started my current sermon series and the small group discussion material that goes with it, it came out of an effort to do some lessons that could help us with "getting back to normal." I chose this series because I was so often hearing that expression, "I will be glad when we can get back to normal." Which from the context of COVID makes a lot of sense. There have been so many things in our lives, including church, that have not been normal, in fact, much of it has been tragic, debilitating, and unnerving. We look forward to taking our masks off and seeing each other smile and giving each other long hugs. We look forward to assembling in large groups close together without fear of becoming a super spreader event. We look forward to traveling freely again and seeing loved ones that we have only heard on the phone or seen on the screen. We look forward to just coming in from work and deciding to go out and eat in our favorite crowded restaurant. We look forward to kids being able to go to school, participate in sports and extracurricular activities in a normal way. As for church, we look forward to a worship service where we can sit close to people we love and sing songs we love with full voice and take communion without peeling back the seal on a plastic cup to eat what looks like a plastic wafer and drink juice that tests whether we still have our sense of taste and smell. We want to go back to normal, for the abnormal has been uncomfortable and distracting from where our hearts want to be in worship; and worse for some, it has produced anger, contempt, division, and unfaithfulness. We want to get back to normal, and for good reasons.

But what started as a small series of lessons to help us restart our normal has become a huge project and theme for the year. And I am extremely excited about it and feel led by the Spirit to expand it. The theme is, "BETTER THAN NORMAL!" If you haven't caught on yet — I believe with all my heart God is leading us to not just go back to normal, but to go back BETTER THAN NORMAL! We need to take a look at every thing we are doing as a church and see if we are doing what we should according to God's will and for the mission of the Church, and do it the very best we can. Someone asked me last Sunday, "David, when are you going to tell us what we are going to change?" Great question, but not so fast! The destination is BETTER THAN NORMAL, but don't skip the journey! Let's enjoy working through these things together.

We are taking restarting principles from Ezra and Nehemiah, then we are looking at what our Lord taught about these from a New Kingdom perspective. Then we will see how these were applied to the Church and Christian practices. Let's study God's Word on some things that are just taken for granted as being our normal right way of doing it, and ask "Is this really what Christ wants us to do and can it be done better?"

For example, what are we doing with prayer, how can we do it better? How about the authority and application of God's Word, how can we do it better? How about worship, how can we do it better? How about the work of the church in the community, how can we do it better? How about church leadership, how can we do it better? How about discipleship of our members and evangelism of the lost, how can we do it better? BETTER THAN NORMAL!

I encourage you to take advantage of the opportunities to join this journey to BETTER THAN NOR-MAL because our Lord is BETTER THAN NORMAL, and he deserves our BEST! Follow the sermon and participate in a small group follow-up discussion. Come to Bible Classes. Come to my Wednesday night class on "Christ in the Old Testament." You might be surprised by what important topics we are studying. For example, we will be studying from Genesis chapters 2-3 the next few weeks discussing marriage and gender issues dealing with God's created plan, the impact of sin, the redemption brought by Christ, and what it means for the Church. 
21 DAYS OF PRAYER AND FASTING DAILY CALENDAR
