HYMN OF THE DAY: The hymn of the day is our processional hymn, *All Glory, Laud, and Honor.* The hymn begins by praising Jesus as the redeemer king. As the crowd adorned Jesus with palm branches and shouts of "Hosanna!", we acclaim Jesus with praise and prayers and anthems. But unlike Israel of old, who offered these things to Jesus before his passion, we offer them to Jesus following his exaltation. We recognize the full glory of Christ's reign. He is the king of kings and lord of lords, triumphant over death and hell through his victory on the cross.

ABOUT THE BULLETIN COVER: Though Jesus was met with the shouts of "Hosanna!" and hands waving palms, He would be delivered days later into the hands of sinners with shouts of "Crucify Him!" Palm Sunday is a day of contrasts. We see the guilt of our sin for which we are called to repent. But we also see the Lord who comes to redeem us. With palms in our hands, we—on the other side of Jesus' cross and resurrection—praise Him as our King, who overcame sin and death for us.
