## **Holy Week**

*Christ was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross.  
But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all names.*

The second reading for Palm Sunday is the great canticle from the letter to the Philippians, and it sums up elegantly the whole journey of Christ's coming among us in the flesh, his death on the cross, his resurrection and his ascension into glory. It provides a constant refrain throughout this coming week – the Great Week.

St Paul shares it with us as an example of how we should be, and this, I think, brings us to the heart of what can happen to us if we accept the invitation to become sharers in Christ's saving work. The Paschal (Easter) Mystery that we celebrate through signs perceptible to the senses can re-shape and re-make us after the pattern of Jesus's own dying and rising.

If that is going to happen then we need to allow it to shape the whole pattern of this week. We will need to make time for prayer each day, to read prayerfully the Gospels from the Last Supper to Easter Day, to allow time to consider the mysteries of the Eucharist and of the Cross, to fast on Good Friday, to keep Holy Saturday as a day of waiting, to feast on Easter Sunday and for the whole week that follows. It will be helped if we can arrange the week so that we don't need to go shopping or watch the usual TV or stuff on the internet on Friday and Saturday. If we can, postpone the exciting things of the holiday until Sunday, relishing instead the simplicity that has otherwise been an imposition for much of the last year.

Usually, I would encourage you to come and participate in the various liturgies that mark this week, but with COVID that will be rather limited this year. I would urge you instead to throw yourselves into them in every other aspect of your lives this week. In prayer, fasting and feasting.

### **Mass Responses for Palm Sunday**

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out: Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!

O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory! Who is this king of glory? He, the Lord of hosts, he is the king of glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!

PSALM RESPONSE: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory! Christ was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all names. Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory!

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Father, if this chalice cannot pass without my drinking it, your will be done.

**The Easter Fast** Lent finishes on Maundy Thursday and we move into two days of fasting in preparation for Easter. Good Friday is a day of Fasting and Abstinence (from meat). Fasting is encouraged also on Holy Saturday, and if you are not fasting, I would encourage you to keep it as a day of simplicity.

At the time of writing most of the **liturgies** are fully booked, but there are a few places for

- Mass on Maundy Thursday
- Stations of the Cross on Good Friday for families with primary age children
- Mass at Noon on Easter Sunday.

We are pleased that we have been able to find a place at one of the liturgies for nearly everyone who wished to come. Please feel free to make contact and ask to go on a waiting list for any 'returns'.

## Collections over Easter

To keep things simple there are some new envelopes at the back that can be used to do this: if you have a current Gift Aid declaration just fill in your name, and if not please complete all the details on the envelope. If you have a box of numbered Gift Aid envelopes these also include one that can be used at Easter.

If you are donating at Farncombe, please use a St Edmund's envelope and not one for St John's!

We hope to have contactless terminals available for those who might wish to give by card.

**Good Friday** There will be a retiring collection for the support of the sacred sites in the Holy Land. This is important for those Christian communities at a time when pilgrims are few.

**Maundy Thursday** By tradition gifts are offered for the poor on this day, and Churches Together are encouraging donations in money or kind to the Food Bank. 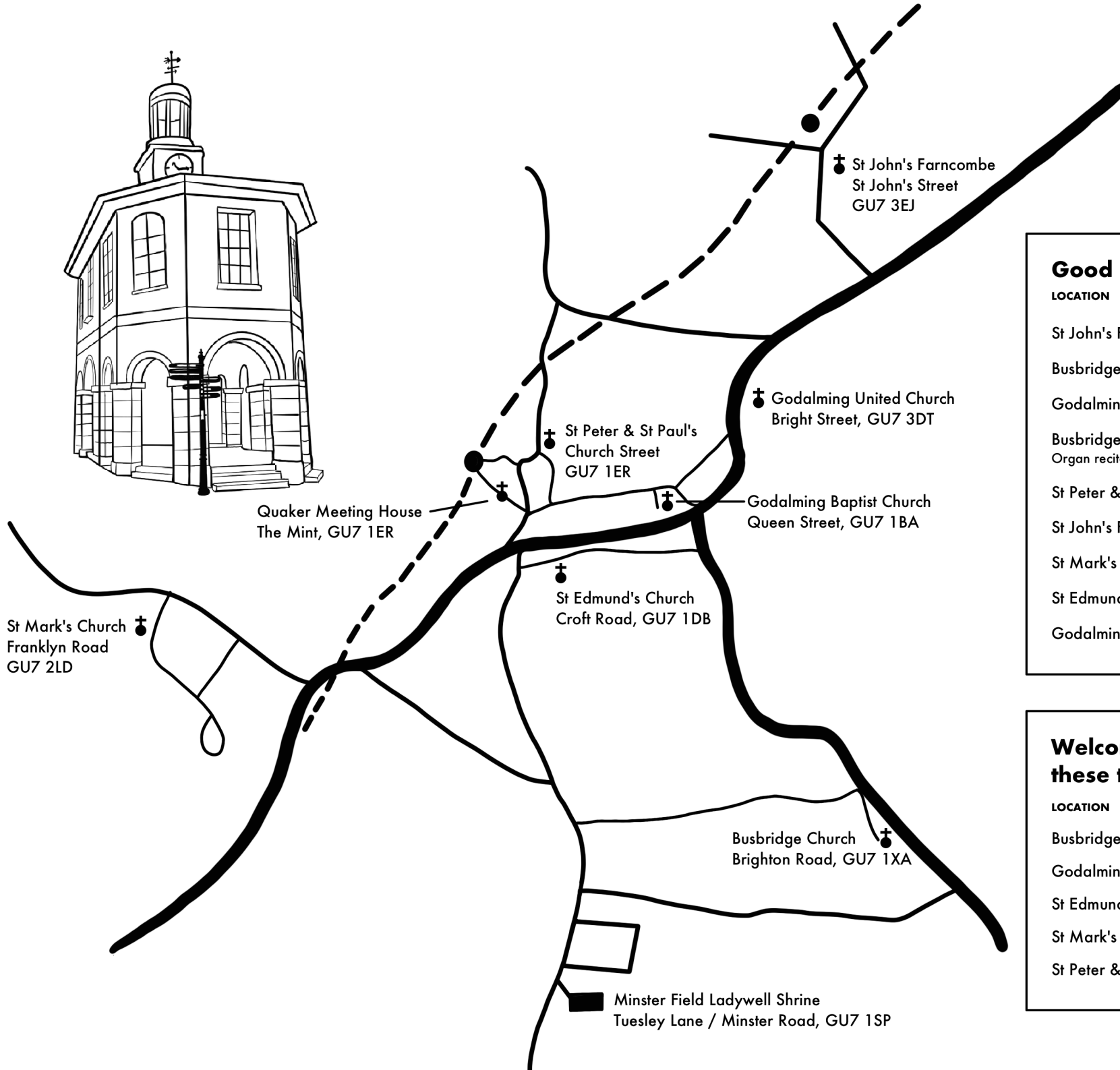
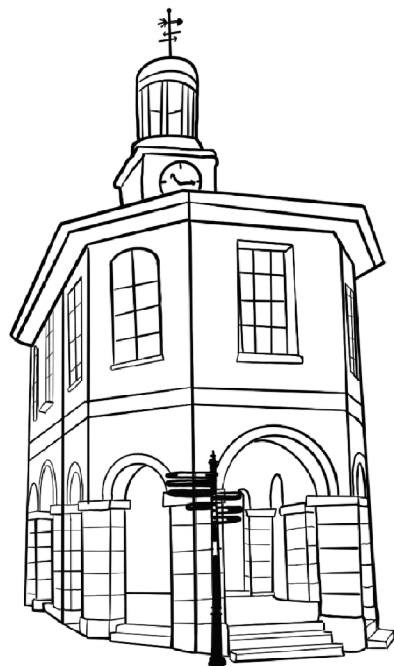
