A New Covenant Written Upon Your Heart

WELCOME to *your* faith community! We are happy to worship with you today and pray that your spirit will be blessed by our time together in the presence of God. If this is your first time at Zion, welcome! If you have been with us for some time, welcome!

Today, we celebrate Palm Sunday, Christ's joyous entrance into Jerusalem as we begin to look at the entire passion of Holy Week before celebrating the resurrection on Easter Sunday. There is too much that happens in the narratives of the scriptures from Palm Sunday's palm waving and shouts of Hosanna, to the wonder and glory of Resurrection Sunday on Easter with the laughing shouts of "He is Risen" without some sense of the valley in between these two high points. "Hosanna," as the ancient Israelites shouted out at Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem translates as "Save us" or "Save now." This is a call to the savior, even though later usage of the term was for the king and was seen as a sound of celebration rather than a plea for help. But we can certainly claim both usages in our worship and life today. The question to consider this Palm Sunday is who do you declare Sovereign of your life today?

As we encounter Palm Sunday and throughout holy week, we invite you to let the story of Christ's passion unfold in your mind and heart as we consider how Christ's love and sacrifice, the highs and the lows of Holy Week, impact our lives today as individuals and as a congregation. An important component of this crucial element of our faith includes the invitation to serve our community and walk even closer to our Lord. We will enter into the story more deeply on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

Let us Repair: For Such a Time as This as we view Palm Sunday through the lens of redemption! Come, let us worship our Redeemer!

Gospel Lesson

Mark 11:1-11 (NRSV) Pastor Katie

¹ When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples ² and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. ³ If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." ⁴ They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, ⁵ some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" ⁶ They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. ⁷ Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. ⁸ Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. ⁹ Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! ¹⁰ Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" ¹¹ Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.


