Resurrection and Reconnection *Joy*

After Jesus' resurrection, he reconnected with his disciples in different ways at different times and places. He reconnected with Mary Magdalene, Salome, and Mary the mother of Joses outside the tomb in early morning on the first day of the week. He reconnected to the disciples locked in the upper room in the evening, on the road to Emmaus in the afternoon, on the shore of the Sea of Galilee for breakfast. He reconnected with hundreds of people in the forty days between his resurrection and ascension. Upon recognizing Christ, people experienced reconnection joy. Remember Mary Magdalene's joyful, "Rabbouni!" (John 20:16). Remember the two disciples gushing, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us...?" (Luke 24:32).

Our hearts are certainly burning for community. As we emerge from this pandemic tomb, this is a time of resurrection and reconnection joy!

As the resurrected Christ appeared to his disciples, there was something different about him. Jesus' appearance had changed but his forward-focused, God-centered Spirit remained. He retained the marks of his history but kept moving forward and sending his followers to continue the work he began. We are emerging into a different world and approaches to ministry may look different but the spirit of ministry remains. We still seek to fulfill the charge of Christ—to go forth and make disciples of all nations. As we move forward offering hospitality, healing help and hope, leading hearts to Christ, we have a new reality to explore, to embrace, and new opportunities ahead with God.

Resurrection is about new life. Something has to die or be released for resurrection to occur. The place to reconnect may be different from your previous connections. As we reconnect, consider making new connections. Consider nurturing the next generations by connecting with Children's ministry, helping with Sunday School or VBS for a season. We need volunteers who want to have some fun with our UEMY's and Youth group. Perhaps you have a community project where we can gather to lend our hands. Maybe a social justice cause like eradicating hunger or homelessness in the Salt Lake Valley is a passion. If music is your gift, volunteer with the choir or lead the Praise Band. Reconnect in a way that makes your heart sing and other hearts will

Surrounded by the Love of God

The journey from Lent to Easter and going forward from Resurrection has always had special meaning for Ann and me. It started for us during Lent many years ago when we made the decision to remove our son, Justin, from life support provided by a ventilator that he had been on for more than a week. It was the last of 20 hospitalizations we went thru early in his life during a 4 year period of time.

We felt the love of God during his life; but especially the last few weeks he lived, thru the caring people and community of Minnehaha UMC church, where we were members. We felt the love of God, thru the nurses, doctors, respiratory therapists, chaplains, PICU providers, and our special pediatrician, lovingly known by many as Dr. Dan, all at Minneapolis Children's Hospital. We felt the love of God thru our close friends who did not know what to say to parent's grieving the death of their son but demonstrated thru their many acts of kindness and desire to never let go of seeing us in the pain and deep valley that we were in. We knew the love of God was present thru our families, but we also knew they did not know how to support us and show us their love during our healing and wellness journey that we were on from the Resurrection of our son. But we still felt surrounded by the Love of God.

The Dr. Reverend Howard Thurman, in his book *Meditations of the Heart*, writes about this in #49, "Surrounded by the Love of God." Quoting, "The magic of wind, sun, and rain creates a climate that nourishes every living thing. It is law, and more than law; it is order, and more than order--- there is a

brooding tenderness out of which all comes. In the contemplation of the earth, I know that I am surrounded by the love of God." ...and "The edge of hope that constantly invades the seasoned grounds of despair, the faith that keeps watch at the doors though which pass all labors of my life and heart for what is right and true, the impulse to forgive and to seek forgiveness even when the injury is sharp and clear—these and countless other things make me know that by day and by night my life is surrounded by the love of God."

Since Justin's death, our friend Wayne has mailed us a card acknowledging his death and resurrection, during the first week of March year after year since his passing. On Justin's birth date, arriving exactly on that day, six months later, we receive a birthday card in our son's memory. Like God surrounds us by His Love, all the time; Wayne too surrounds us year by year, with his love and memory of our son. He never met Justin, but through family to family sharing of whom Justin was, Wayne has surrounded us with his personal love for God and sharing that love of God with us!

For those like me who don't wait well and really, really like going fast, thank you to our staff, our teachers, and you, our Hilltop community for all you have already done this year, and all of last year. I know the excitement to go fast is reaching its own fever-pitch, as more and more are safer from the vaccines. Keep holding on to our promise to go together. And take some moments outside in the woods and mountains and do a very un—quiet Irish jig, or in my case, designate it as an Irish-Scottish jig.

WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR?

Children's Books for Discussion of Race and Inequality at Home

This month, I'm sharing a fun new series that our family enjoyed reading during Women's History Month in March. Zoey is a Black girl in elementary school and Sas-safras is her pet cat and sidekick. Zoey is learning the family business from her mother--a business that serves magical creatures who ring the barn doorbell when they need help. Zoey is also a scientist, and all of the magical creatures' ailments can be solved by using the scientific method!

This Month's Books: Zoey and Sassafras series (we've tried 3 volumes: Dragons and Marshmallows, Monsters and Mold, and Merhorses and Bubbles, but there are 8 available in total to date) Story by Asia Citro, Pictures by Marion Lindsay

Available in the Salt Lake County and Salt Lake City Library systems

Summary: We don't have space to summarize all of the books, so I'll choose one example. In "Monsters and Mold," Zoey helps a monster named Gorp try to get rid of the unsightly mold in his fur so he can confidently attend the Monster Ball. She searches for a mold removal treatment by performing a carefully controlled experiment (don't want to spoil the particulars!) and the thought she puts into her experimental design, her iterative process, and her observations in her laboratory notebook are woven into the narrative. I love that this series features a young woman of color working as an amateur scientist and

also includes magic that makes the stories fun. Not only are these exciting adventure stories, but they give great examples of how to use scientific principles to solve everyday problems. What an empowering message for kids! Also, Zoey treasures her "Thinking Goggles," which immediately made her one of my all-time favorite book characters. The series website, zoeyandsassafras.com, has information about all of the books as well as complementary activities that can be printed for free to build on what you learn in the books. Maybe you can find some projects that would be fun to try over spring break!

What Do The Kids Think?

Heidi- I liked that Zoey used science to help the magical creatures.

Clark- I liked when Zoey helped the baby dragon Marshmallow find food.

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

1. How do you help others in your community? How could you use your unique skills and talents to help others solve their problems?
2. What does a scientist look like? Who can be a scientist?
