The Nicene Creed

Text: Luke 24:1-27; Romans 6:4-14 Title: The Day of Christ's Resurrection

Introduction

- I. The Day of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ should have been anticipated with joyous expectation!
- II. The Day of the resurrection of Jesus Christ affirms His Person and Work.
 - A. The resurrection confirms the unique Person of Jesus Christ.
 - B. The resurrection confirms the unique purpose for which Christ died the accursed death of the cross.

III. The resurrection of Jesus Christ and you.

- A. Forgiveness of sins, righteousness, and eternal life are yours through faith in the crucified, dead, and risen Jesus Christ.
- B. New life, spiritual life, everlasting life are yours through faith in the crucified, dead, and risen Jesus Christ.
- C. Sanctification, holiness, and godliness of life, Christlikeness is yours through faith in the crucified, dead, and risen Jesus Christ.
