PASTORAL PONDERINGS

Dr. Bert Welch, Interim Pastor BUNNIES, EGGS, AND HOPE

As Christians, we celebrate Easter because of the glorious resurrection of Jesus from the tomb on the third day after his crucifixion. Easter is the fulfilled prophecy of the Messiah who would be persecuted, die for our sins, and rise on the third day. Remembering the resurrection of Jesus is a way to renew the hope that we have in our own resurrection and our victory over sin in Christ.

The origin of the word <u>easter</u> isn't certain. Scholars suggest that the word may have come from the Anglo-Saxon *Eeostre* or *Eastre* – a Teutonic goddess of spring and fertility. The rabbit, or hare, associated with Easter, come through pagan celebrations with the most obvious being the rabbit's fertility. Many Ancient cultures viewed eggs as a symbol of life. Hindus, Egyptians, Persians, and Phoenicians believed the world began with an enormous egg.

All of these symbols of Easter have a correlation to our celebration of Christ's resurrection and ought to be clearly explained to our children so they can begin to understand their Christian meaning. Basically, they all speak of the "new life" Jesus offers each of us. But there is one more aspect that I ask you to consider when we think of eggs and rabbits. Notice how we Christians take things that are basically ungodly and even paganistic and turn them into reminders of God's love and grace. My friend, God does that every day. He takes the unholy and turns it holy through faith. That is what he did for me. I once walked in darkness, but he sent the Light into the world. Now I walk in the light and Jesus is THE light. He can take the vilest person and make him clean and whole. He takes the hopeless and gives them hope. God is the God of new beginnings!

Memorial BC April 4, 2021 WHY EASTER MATTERS

1) Jesus is who He claimed to be:

John 11:25 "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live even though He dies."

Matthew 28:5-7 The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you."

John 14:6 Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

2) Jesus has the Power He claimed to have:

Colossians 1:15-18 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by Him all things were created, both is the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things have been created through Him and for Him. He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. He is also head of the body, the church; and He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that He Himself will come to have first place in everything.

John 10:17-18 The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life—only to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father.

3) Jesus does what He promises to do:

Mark 10:34 "They will mock and flog and kill me but after three days I will come back to life."

John 17:1-3 After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you. For you granted him authority over all people that he might give eternal life to all those you have given him. Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.
