THE BLESSING OF THE NEW FIRE


- ¶ A short ante-Communion service will precede the Vigil. The propers may be found on page 161 of the Book of Common Prayer.
- ¶ After the ante-Communion service, <u>please gather outside in front of the church steps</u>.
- ¶ The Priest now blesses the new fire, which will then be conveyed in procession to the Paschal Candle by means of a triple candlestick referred to as "the reed". As the Procession makes its way into the church, we will thrice stop and genuflect as the Priest elevates the fire. Please file into the pews behind the clergy.



At the second and third pause, the Versicle and Response is sung successively a step higher.

¶ The Exsultet, the Church's great hymn of triumph, will now be sung as the Paschal Candle is blessed. Please stand.








THE HOLY COMMUNION
