"Master's Garden of Change"

I love golf. I am not that good at it, and I don't play much. I waited too late in life to start, and it has been too expensive and too time consuming for me to make it a consistent hobby. I have trouble watching it on TV because after a few minutes I want to be out playing, not watching. But the Masters is different – not only is it the best golf, but it is a paradise course. This year the Masters is back to its regular April date in Augusta, Georgia's giant garden course with the azaleas in full bloom on every turn. And this year it comes with controversy for change with the admission of prejudices of the past and its need to stand for equal rights for all in the future. Will the Masters just be hosting great golf this year, or can it be the Master's Garden for Change in social justice and equality?

There was once a beautiful paradise garden of change. It was perfect, until sin entered, and decay began. Curses started and death, and separation from God. Husband and wife started there in perfect unity, and they left disgraced and ashamed. And all of humankind suffered for their disobedience, longing for re-entry to that perfect place of peace, love and the presence of God.

Many years passed and the Master entered a garden in great agony, tortured over the world's captivity to sin.
