Encouraged! is how I can best describe January and February. Both Old Paths and Newcomb Baptist Church are growing stronger spiritually. We have had new visitors, six baptized, and eight precious souls saved! One of those precious souls was our oldest daughter Muriah. I had just got done talking with a young man who had made a profession of faith years ago; he came and was in tears due to his spiritual uncertainty, not long after he got saved. Soon after, Muriah approached her mother and me about doubts about her salvation. We rejoiced that she settled it!

We started a discipleship class on Saturday morning and afternoon. Between the two churches, we have a total of *fifty-one* of our dear folks enrolled. Mrs. Amber takes the children, and she is also teaching them the same material. So far, we have covered the Doctrines of Repentance, Salvation, and Eternal Security. These classes have brought our people back together, and the fellowship has never been so sweet!

Our attendance has been up, and the singing has been outstanding! People come to church ready to hear from God. Please pray for Ganado Baptist Bible College; we are preparing to make our college mobile and offer classes at Newcomb Baptist Church. This location would be closer for other preachers and their folks to take much-needed courses to sharpen their Practical Ministry and Biblical Doctrines knowledge. We desire to help and equip like-faith churches to take what they learn and support their local church to grow stronger.
