For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. The Path to Transformation: Mind \rightarrow Heart

Inductive Bible Study - An investigative way to study the Bible to gain overall understanding of a passage--what it says, what is meant to its original audience and what it means today. It uses three steps of observation, interpretation and application.

Hermeneutics - The method of how to interpret the Bible.

Exegesis - Drawing out or exposing the author's intended meaning of a biblical text.
