Reproach: disapproval

Double-minded:

wavering, uncertain, doubting

divided in interest

torn between God & the world

Repeated + Emphasized Words + Ideas

Doubt - not trusting God, trusting in the world or your own abilities. Divided loyalties.

Doubt makes a person like a wave of the sea.

Something being *driven and tossed by the wind* is a picture of instability and uncertainty.

Not steadfast (previous context)

Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, that I may discern between good and evil, for who is able to govern this your great people?" 10 It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this. 11 And God said to him, "Because you have asked this, and have not asked for yourself long life or riches or the life of your enemies, but have asked for yourself understanding to discern what is right, 12 behold, I now do according to your word. Behold, I give you a wise and discerning mind, so that none like you has been before you and none like you shall arise after you.

Cross References Ask God: Matthew 7:7-11

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. 9 Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? **10** Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent? **11** If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!

Cross References

Asking without Doubting - Matthew 21:21

And Jesus answered them, "Truly, I say to you, if you have faith and do not doubt, you will not only do what has been done to the fig tree, but even if you say to this mountain, 'Be taken up and thrown into the sea,' it will happen.

Cross References like a wave of the sea - Ephesians 4:12-14

And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, 14 so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes.

Cross References Context of James → James 4

Asking with the Right Motives - James 4:2-3

You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions.

Double Minded - James 4:8

Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded.

Cross References Unstable - 2 Peter 2:14 + 3:16

- 2 Peter 2:14 They [false teachers] have eyes full of adultery, insatiable for sin. They entice unsteady souls. They have hearts trained in greed. Accursed children!
- 2 Peter 3:16 As he does in all his letters when he speaks in them of these matters. There are some things in them that are hard to understand, which the ignorant and unstable twist to their own destruction, as they do the other Scriptures.

- -Wisdom is from God
- -God is generous

God generously gives his children the good gift of his wisdom, which includes the understanding, insight or knowledge to discern between good and evil.

Application

How does that aspect of God's character change your view of self?

- -I am not all wise like God. I "lack wisdom" and I need to pray for his wisdom.
- -I will be inclined to doubt God but I should pray in faith, trusting him.
- -I am not stable apart from trusting in God, I will be blown and tossed if my loyalties are divided.
- -I am inclined to be double-minded, with my mind and heart is divided between my flesh and spirit, God and the world. I need to recognize the things in me that are taking my mind and heart away from God.

Application

What should I do in response?

What should I do in response?

- -Praise God for being all-wise and giving generously.
- -Repent of my doubt and double-mindedness.
- -Ask God to help me trust him more (increase my faith), to give me his wisdom, to make my mind and heart to not be divided, but to be devoted to Him.

Study with Prayer

Praying to God as we seek to study his word is the key link between the natural act of studying and the supernatural work of the Holy Spirit.

Things happen because we pray, that would not happen if we did not pray. That is what James means when he says, "You do not have, because you do not ask" (James 4:2). And it is what Jesus means when he says, "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you" (Matt. 7:7). This does not make us God—as if our will were the final arbiter of what happens in the world. But it does mean that our requests, made to God in faith, are part of the way God causes his will to happen. That includes his gracious will in helping us see the fullness of the meaning of his word—its basic message and its glory.
